## **Program Background**

Designated by City Council, Per Title 11.20.060:

Recognizes and protects trees of significant size, age, historical association, or horticultural value









## **Roles and Responsibilities**

#### **Urban Forestry:**

- Implements program
- Permitting and Inspections

#### Heritage Tree Committee:

- Nominations review and recommendations to UFC
- Education and outreach

- Reviewing requests of removal
- Recommendations for New Designations
- Recommendations for Removals of Designation

- Designates Heritage Trees
- Removes Designation

- Space for roots and crown
