The SRV team said that RV and camp removal would be prioritized, and yet a drug dealing RV has been near the SRV for 3 weeks. The city has set up SRVs, but failed the surrounding community. Here is an account from a single mother who lives near the Multnomah SRV, but fears retaliation if she were to voice her opinion, so she wishes to remain anonymous: "Unfortunately, I am woken every night of the week by various noises at the shelter. The noises vary, including dogs barking, doors slamming, music/TV streaming from Bluetooth speakers, people fighting, hammering/construction type noises, loud talking, people banging on doors, and even someone practicing on a drum set. I do call the SRV at night on a regular basis. I also call them when there are loud disturbances during the day (mainly when loud, horrible fighting or a mental crises is happening), and many times they don't answer. It's hard to know if it's currently full, but by the noise level, I'd say it is I can't go on living with little sleep and hearing the terrible fighting and breakdowns on a regular basis." It's completely devoid of data that might actually demonstrate real progress on how successful the SRVs are and whether or not they are providing the so-called "on-ramps to a stable life." The report is a mere 7 pages consisting mostly of pretty graphics vs any real analysis and of those 7 pages one is the cover page, one is a testimonial and two of the remaining pages are a map and a list of community activities provided to the residents. What's not included – a list of services provided such as behavioral health, recovery support, and data on how many villagers utilized those services. "Number of "Safe Nights of Sleep" is not a success metric, number of beds is not a measure of success unless you are setting the bar very low. Those are data points. The report is also incomplete if not deliberately misleading by spending an entire page with testimonial from only one of the SRV locations. There is no data on how these villages impacted the adjacent communities who are hosting these Safe Rest Villages.
