Phase 2 (Oct. – Apr. 2024) Involve/Consult

Share draft strategies, get feedback on prioritization.

- Additional outreach to key stakeholders
- Citywide survey/open house
- BIPOC focus groups and community meetings

Phase 3 (May – July 2024) Adopt/Inform

Make modifications as needed and publish HPS.

- Planning Commission hearing and recommendation
- City Council hearing and adoption
