RESOLVED: That contractors when taking out permits for constructing sidewalks, shall make a deposit of \$5.00 for each fifty feet lineal of said walk, this deposit to be held by the City until all dirt and debris has been so cleaned up by said contractor and if it be not cleaned up within forty-eight hours from the time the street upon which said work is done is completed and opened to traffic by the City Engineer, the said City Engineer shall be authorized to declare said deposit forfeited and the owner or person making such deposit shall pay said amount as the fined and stipulated damages to defray the expense of the removal of such debris.
