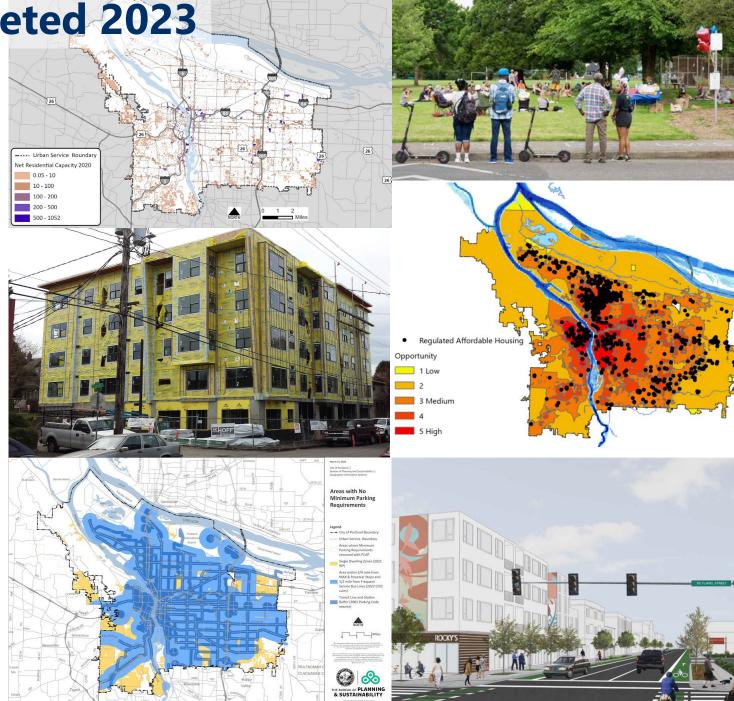

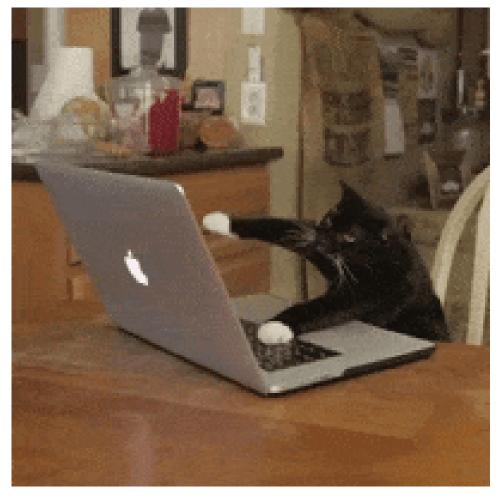


Reconstituted the Portland Planning Commission

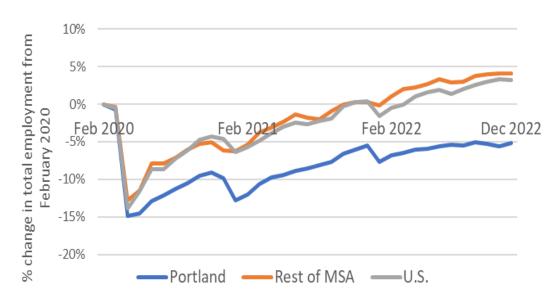

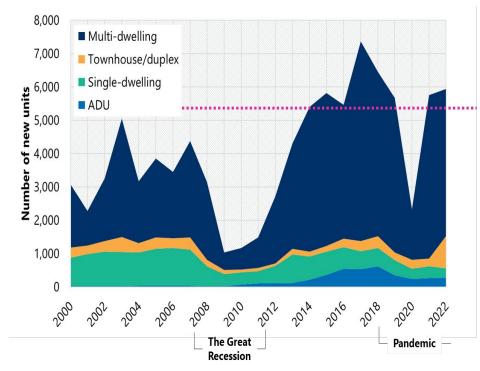

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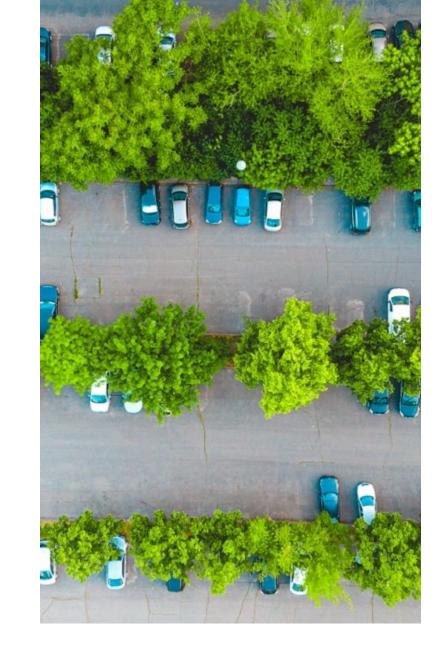
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Parking Compliance Amendment

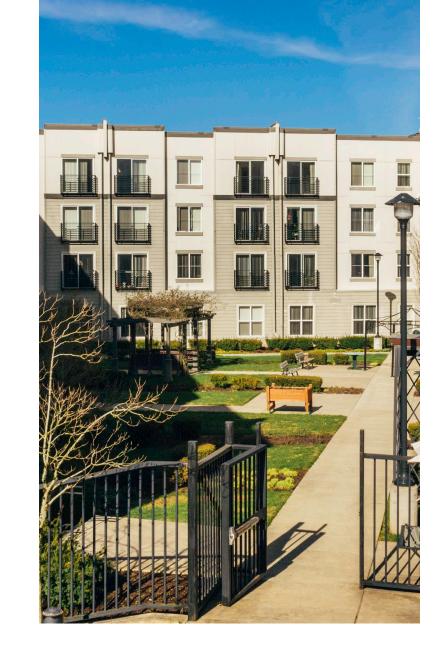
- Removed minimum parking requirements citywide
- Updated and simplified parking maximums
- Added new development standards for surface parking lots
- Required by State administrative rule changes pursuant to the Climate Friendly and Equitable Communities (CFEC) rulemaking

Housing Needs Analysis and Buildable Lands Inventory

- State requirement ensuring that there is enough appropriately zoned land to accommodate housing needs
- Analysis of population trends, housing characteristics and buildable land
- Portland needs to support the development of 120,560 new units of housing by 2045
- Portland needs 63,000 new affordable units by 2045

Housing Regulatory Relief

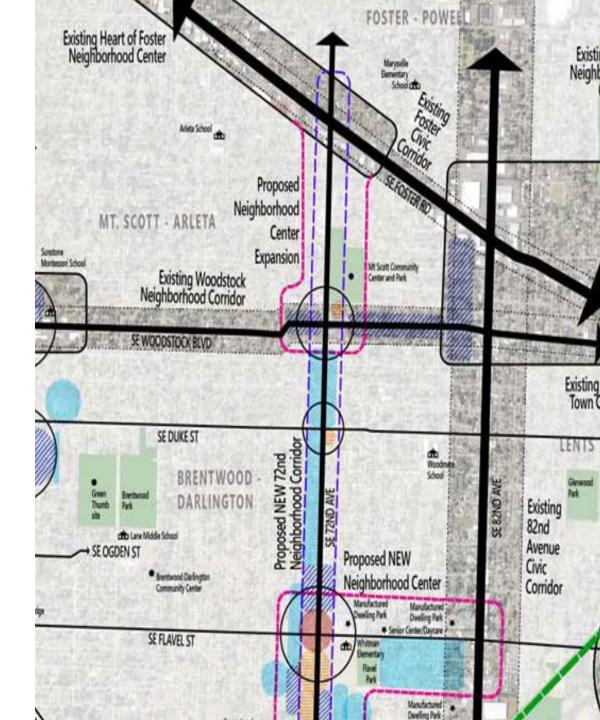
- Aims to increase housing production by providing regulatory relief for developers of apartments and mixed-use developments.
- Creates both temporary waivers and permanent changes to zoning regulations.

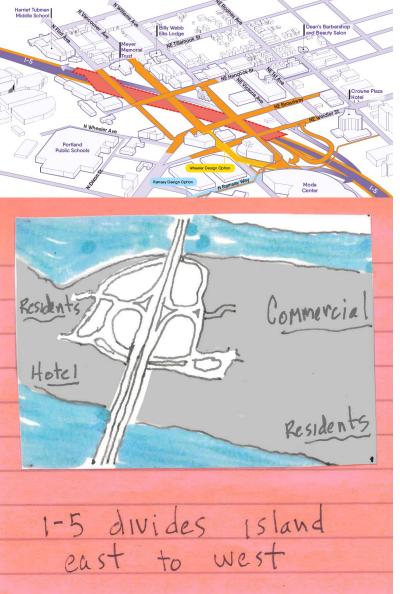
