About the project

- Pave a multi-use path and build one mid-block ADA ramp between NE 106th Avenue and San Rafael Street in the Parkrose Heights neighborhood
- Project goals include pedestrian-scale lighting & minimizing tree impacts
- More accessible walking, biking & rolling path on a Safe Routes to School Primary Investment Route
- Complete an unfunded section of the 100's Neighborhood Greenway

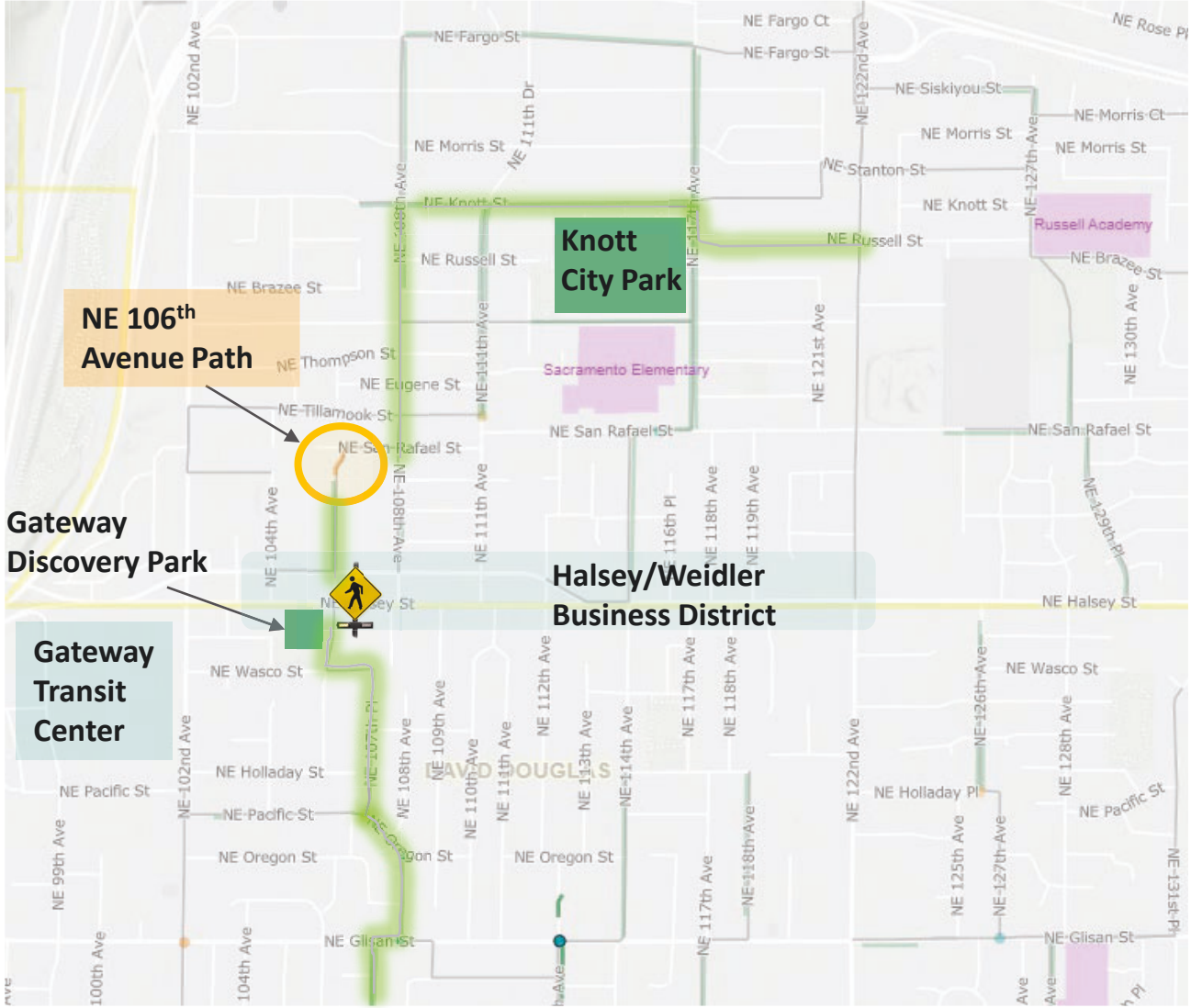

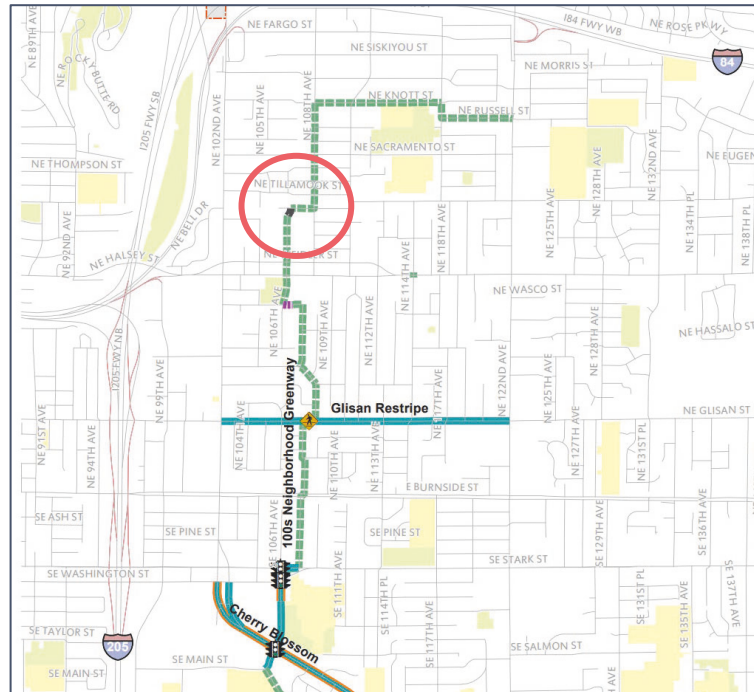
