Director's Update	<ul> <li>Helmi Hisserich, Director of the Portland Housing Bureau, introduced herself to the Committee for the first time and gave the following updates with assistance from Leslie Goodlow: <ul> <li>Director Hisserich comes from the City of Los Angeles with 25 years of experience in housing and community development.</li> <li>New budget process as the city moves into the Charter change. Budget was submitted in February.</li> <li>Decision package around the returning Tax Inclement Finance (TIF).</li> <li>Charter transition is moving forward, there will be temporary Deputy City Administrators appointed in July for each of the service areas.</li> <li>PHB has been operating as the "Community &amp; Economic Development" service area for about a year now, along with the Bureau of Development Services, Bureau of Planning Sustainability, and Prosper Portland.</li> <li>In July, City Council will be moving out of City Hall and into other space as they renovate City Hall to make space for 12 City Commissioners.</li> <li>Interim Deputy Director, Michael Buonocore joined-in to talk about funds geared towards mitigating security concerns in PHB's N/NE properties.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	00:02:29 – 00:15:28

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	<ul> <li>Racial &amp; ethnicity demographics: 86% are Black/African Americans.</li> <li>Household income demographics: most new homeowners were within 60 – 80% Area Medium Income (AMI).</li> <li>The committee met on February 20, 2024, for a special meeting to approve the increase of Down Payment Assistance to \$150,000.00 in the North /Northeast Area.</li> </ul>	
Preference Policy (PP) Updates	<ul> <li>Dyvisha Gordon and Niki Luneclair presented updates regarding North/Northeast Preference Policy and Security Deposit Grant Assistance Pilot Program:         <ul> <li>Preference Policy (PP) Application submissions for the last two months: 131 in January and 198 in February</li> <li>About 2,000 on the PP wait list</li> <li>Point cohort breakdown: large number of folks that apply are part of the 0-point category. Future breakdown will clear-up any duplicates.</li> <li>Security Deposit Grant Assistance Pilot Program is a joint effort between the Rental Services Office and the Preference Policy Team.</li> <li>This Pilot Program is to give grant assistance to households moving into rental units, to cover security deposits and a variety of other moving expenses. Limitation of \$1,000 per household.</li> <li>Program launch was in January 2024. Low acceptance rates at buildings are contributing to underutilization of the program. PHB will work closely with Partners to make sure their leasing staff is educated on the program.</li> <li>\$56,300 was set aside for direct assistance, program total is about \$75,000 to account for operational expenses.</li> <li>N/NE Preference Policy Homeownership application open from March 19th through April 18th.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	00:21:29 – 00:40:13
Housing Production Strategies	<ul> <li>Ariel Kane with the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability gave a presentation on Housing Production Strategy (HPS):</li> <li>2045 housing forecast: 120,560 new units needed.</li> <li>Data shows that the city should be planning for more than 50% of housing to be affordable to those that earn 80% AMI or less.</li> <li>2045 Housing considerations: different types of housing are needed.
