Emergency Ordinance

*Amend Intergovernmental Agreement with the Oregon Department of Transportation for the Brentwood-Darlington Safe Routes to School Project (amend Ordinance 189376)

Passed

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) applied to Metro as part of the 2019 - 2021 Regional Flexible Funds program for a federal grant in the amount of \$2,200,000 for design engineering and construction of the Brentwood-Darlington Safe Routes to School Project in 2017; and
- 2. The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) granted PBOT the amount of \$2,200,000 through an intergovernmental agreement for the design and construction of the Brentwood-Darlington Safe Routes to School Project in 2019; and
- 3. ODOT amended the intergovernmental agreement in 2020 to reduce the Federal funding for the project to no more than \$2,159,999.40; and
- 4. This amendment was not brought before City Council for approval due to staff oversight and disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- 5. ODOT will now grant PBOT for the design and construction of the Brentwood-Darlington Safe Routes to School Project an additional amount of \$282,483.50 for a new total of \$2,442,482.90; and
- 6. PBOT will supplement these grant funds with \$2,200,000 in American Rescue Plan (ARPA) funds and an additional \$3,150,000 from the Transportation System Development Charge fund. The total project cost is \$7,792,483.90.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
