



- Ashkelon is home to the world's largest water desalination plant, the Israeli Beer Breweries & some of finest most creative young entrepreneurs.



About PKSCA

Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association promotes people to people exchanges of educational, artistic, and cultural activities. PKSCA maintains several programs that focus on and support our mission. These include the annual Portland Rose Festival Dragon Boat Race, participation in the Portland Rose Festival Grand Floral Parade, and Starlight Parade, annual good will delegation exchanges between Portland and Kaohsiung, and support of Portland Chinese/Taiwanese organizations and programs.

Dragon Boat Race

The Portland Rose Festival Dragon Boat Race is an annual cultural event hosted by the Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association (PKSCA) that is held in early June as a sanctioned event of the Portland Rose Festival Foundation. The event features as many as 96 dragon boat teams from all over the world who race in Taiwan-style dragon boats. There are three divisions: Mixed, Women, and High School. The race is held on the Willamette River located at Tom McCall Waterfront Park in downtown Portland.





Declamation Platform for Peace

PKSCA declaims this Platform for Peace to articulate a basis for the end of hostilities between Russia and Ukraine:

- That is consistent with international law;
- That recognizes the preeminence of human rights over the juridical rights of nation-states;
- That is culturally equitable; and
- Which ensures the well-being of the Russian and Ukrainian peoples in perpetuity.



A PLATFORM FOR PEACE IN UKRAINE

PREAMBLE

With deep respect for the Russian people, and acting in accordance with the purpose for which the Portland-Khabarovsk Sister City Association (hereinafter "the Association") was organized thirty-six years ago, to wit: to foster and promote cultural, social, educational, and economic relations and to further international understanding, friendship, and goodwill between Portland, Oregon and Khabarovsk, Russia, and to promote the well-being of the public

the Board of Directors of the Association declaims this Platform for Peace to articulate a basis for the end of hostilities between Russia and Ukraine that is consistent with international law, that recognizes the preeminence of human rights over the juridical rights of nation-states, that is culturally equitable, and which ensures the well-being of the Russian and Ukrainian peoples in perpetuity.

The Board of Directors of the Association hereby recommends to its Members and to all others who may wish to endorse this Platform for Peace the following Articles.

ARTICLES

- Art. 1. We understand the history of the region in which Russia and Ukraine coexist but believe that present-day circumstances require adherence to, and mutual respect for, their shared international boundary in the interests of peace and prosperity.
- Art. 2. We recognize Russia and Ukraine, individually and equally, as nation-states with all rights afforded under international law, including but not limited to the inviolability of their territorial limits as declared in the Belovezha Accords and as later affirmed by acts of lawfully authorized representatives of the former Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.
- Art. 3. We believe that militarily imposed "spheres of influence" are antithetical to the sovereignty of modern nation-states and that in an age of long-range missiles, satellities and nuclear armaments that such attempts at hegemony are counterproductive. Fair competition for the affinity and cooperation of neighboring nation-states should be encouraged.
- Art. 4. We oppose any aggression that imperils the Russian people or Russia's sovereignty. We oppose any aggression that imperils the Utrainian people or Utraine's sovereignty. We understand that some Russian people (or "peoples") live in Utraine and that some Utrainian people (or "peoples") live in Russia. Nevertheless, we reject irredentism as irreconcilable with the concept of a modern nation-state. Likewise, we call on both Russia and PKSCA Patrom for Prace

Ukraine to protect all peoples living within their territorial limits without discrimination and irrespective of their claimed nationality, heritage or cultural affinity. Cultural norms and practices, so long as they do not infringe upon basic human rights or substantially impair the rights of nation-states, must be protected wherever they exist.

- Art. 5. As a corollary to the rights of nation-states as juridical persons (e.g., as a practical legal construct dating back to the Peace of Westphalia), we believe that emigration and immigration across territorial boundaries must be recognized as a basic human right subject only to balancing against the territorial rights of nation-states.
- Art. 6. We understand that the military power of nation-states can be usurped by individual and/or corporate actors to advance their private interests. We urge all nation-states to enact and enforce such statutes as necessary to ensure that private interests falsely purported to be national interests are not advanced by the military power of nation-states.
- Art. 7. We understand that some defensive postures can be fairly perceived as aggression and urge all nations to mutually and cooperatively disarm and stand down as necessary to assure peace among all nationstates.

PORTLAND - MUTARE SISTER CITY ASSOCIATION

- Established in 1991 out of a response to Apartheid in Southern Africa, the Portland-Mutare Sister City supports humanitarian efforts in Mutare and surrounding villages in Manicaland.
- Mutare, an inland port city, is a located in the Eastern Highlands on the Mozambique border.
- Mutare is the third largest city in the Zimbabwe with a background in forestry, farming, and tourism. It remains a region known for growing coffee beans, especially in the Vumba.

This clinic built as part of sister city effort between 2000 and 2008 is currently well equipped and serving a 15 km diameter service area. In addition to acting as a medical hub for the region, it has become a HIV testing center and provides antiretroviral therapy to anyone who tests positive.

FAMILY AIDS SUPPORT ORGANIZATION (FASO)

FASO currently has 47 members with HIV and provides support to 4 child-headed households

Priorities include:

- Access to vitamins and medical care outside of antiretroviral treatment
- Access to food, many individuals are struggling to get their basic needs met, often supplementing contract income with fetching and selling firewood.
- School fees for children of people with HIV

Yasui Brothers Translation Project With Oregon Historical Society




Min (Minoru) Yasui (1916-86)

One of four Japanese Americans who fought the legality of exclusion and/or detention during World War II all the way to the Supreme Court. In 2015, Min became the first Presidential Medal of Freedom (posthumous) winner from Oregon.


Masuo Yasui (1886-1957)

Min Yasui's father. He immigrated from Japan to Portland, then opened a general store in Hood River. As a leader in the Japanese community, six days after the outbreak of war, Masuo was arrested by FBI agents, and charged with being a "potentially dangerous enemy alien."



Suzhou China

- Suzhou, founded in 514 BC.
- Shortest travel time can be only 21 minutes between Shanghai and Suzhou by highspeed Train.
- A major economic center and focal point of trade and commerce in China.
- Population of approximately 7 million people in the city proper and 13 million people in the administrative area.
- Average GDP growth rates have been as much as 14% in the past 35 years.
- Famous for its World Heritage classical gardens, dating back to the 6th century BC.
- Suzhou and Portland in 1987 agree to build the Lan Su Chinese Classical Garden as a symbol of friendship and for the promotion of international tourism.
- Shortly thereafter the Portland- Suzhou Sister City Association in 1988 is formed.


The Suzhou Ballet Theatre, the Suzhou Symphony Orchestra and Kunqu Opera provided a short performance

As a world cultural heritage site, the Master-of-Nets Garden in Suzhou is a representative of Chinese classical gardens with a history of more than 800 years. Lan Su Chinese Garden in Portland is a typical Suzhou-style garden, which is consistent with the concept of a Suzhou classical garden of pursuing cozy, natural and people-oriented life. It has been awarded the "Human Settlements Award" by the government of Oregon, USA.

In 2001, the Master-of-Nets Garden and Lan Su Chinese Garden signed a friendship garden agreement. The year 2023 marked the 35th anniversary of the establishment of friendship cities between Suzhou and Portland as signified by this signing ceremony.

Visit to Lviv

August 2023

In August 2023, our President and Secretary traveled to Lviv. Due to ongoing Russian invasion and acts of terror against civilians, there is no civilian air traffic over Ukraine, so all travel into Ukraine is by car, bus, train, or on foot. Our members were warmly met in Lviv and had several meetings, both with Lviv City administration officials and members of Lviv public who had been working towards a sister city relationship between our two cities for a number of years.

Instagram celebrity #Ivivcitycat Levchyk ("Little Lion") also welcomed us at the City Hall in his official capacity as Cat Mayor of Lviv. He let us hold him and pet him before hurrying to another appointment.

At the invitation of Ms. Dzhyhovska, we toured Unbroken Rehabilitation Center. Since the start of the all-out Russian invasion in 2022, Lviv has become a major humanitarian and medical center providing shelter to hundreds of thousands of refugees from the occupied areas of Ukraine and offering medical and other services to its growing population.











Visit to Lviv

August 2023

Visit to Lviv offered many opportunities to enjoy the city's art, culture, coffeeshops and bookstores.

We also had the pleasure of touring the new campus of Ukrainian Catholic University based on the master plan developed by University of Oregon Associate Professor Gerald Gast and graduate students from the Urban Projects Workshop at the College of Design in Portland.

Most of our days and some nights in Lviv were interrupted by air raid alarms; we had to get accustomed to going to bomb shelters as part of Lviv's reality of a city in wartime.

"Coffee with Lviv" was our first event of 2024 starting early on Saturday, February 24, 2024. We met at 7 am at Just Bob on NE Alberta for an early morning Lviv Latte and a live link to Lviv. Our counterparts in Lviv connected from a Lviv art space where they enjoyed afternoon coffee and opportunities to speak to people in Portland.





Believe in Ukraine

February 24, 2024

At Pioneer Square—the Heart of Portland—Portlanders joined people in over 100 cities around the world in marking a decade of Ukrainian resilience in their struggle against Russian imperialism.
