

LID Map




Project Goals

Coordinated New Multiagency Infrastructure

- 1) Reduce utilities' risk underneath Union Pacific Railroad tracks
- 2) Fully reconstruct streets in very poor condition
- 3) Build hundreds of new housing units, affordable and market rate
- 4) Break up superblock and improve fire suppression capability
- 5) Achieve potential of St. Johns Pedestrian District and river access
- 6) Support pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure for regional access
- 7) Reduce gap in greenway trail along Willamette River
- 8) Support potential future transit service within LID boundary
