





LOWER SOUTHEAST RISING


The <u>Bureau of Planning and Sustainability</u> (BPS) and <u>Portland Bureau of Transportation</u> (PBOT) are collaborating with community members to assess land use and transportation issues for Brentwood-Darlington and portions of the Lents, Ardenwald-Johnson Creek, Mt Scott-Arleta, and Woodstock neighborhoods. This planning effort is called the <u>Lower Southeast Rising Area Plan</u>.

Recap of Summer Engagement

There were more than 1,500 responses, providing project staff with valuable information about community priorities and needs. We also engaged with residents in various other ways, such as community interviews, door-to-door canvasing, a neighborhood bike ride, and advisory committee meetings. 
Background

The Lower Southeast Rising Area Plan aims to address the historic lack of infrastructure investment in parts of SE and East Portland – including Brentwood-

Darlington and portions of Mt. Scott-Arleta, Woodstock and Lents. Project staff are seeking community input to guide healthy community development.

City staff are working with a local Project Advisory Committee, a Technical Advisory Committee, community-based organizations, neighborhood associations, and neighbors for input and engagement to guide the plan's recommendations with an emphasis on anti-displacement and affordable housing strategies.

The project was launched in January 2021, and a final plan is expected to go before City Council in early 2023.



The Lower Southeast Rising Area Plan analyzes the residential and commercial areas highlighted in the map with a core focus on the Brentwood-Darlington neighborhood.
