Past Council Presentations

April 2022 Council accepted 82nd Avenue

Jurisdictional Transfer

and accepted \$80 million ARPA funding

June 2022 Council authorized a contract for the design of the

82nd Avenue Major Maintenance Project

December 2022

Council authorized an exemption to the competitive bidding requirements and approved use of a Construction Manager/General Contractor for the 82nd Ave Major Maintenance Project

May 2024

Council authorized PBOT to acquire certain temporary and permanent rights of way for the 82nd Avenue Major Maintenance Project













Building a Better 82nd

A multi-year investment with many projects

2022 - 2026:

Critical Fixes Projects

- Major Maintenance Project (paving, signals, ramps)
- Street lighting
- Additional pedestrian crossings and signals
- Tree planting
- Additional safety improvements

2026 and beyond:

Phase 2 Improvements

- More safety and maintenance projects
- Parallel bike network
- Transit project


Building a Better 82nd The Safety and Maintenance Needs are Vast


































Safety 82nd Avenue High Crash Areas

- 82nd Avenue is a High Crash Corridor
- Averages 2 deaths, 13 serious injuries per year
- 5% of citywide totals
- Crash contributing factors:
 - Difficult for pedestrians to cross
 - Driveways
 - Left turns not at signals
 - Vehicle speed
 - Dark conditions

- NE 82nd from Fremont to Schuyler
- SE 82nd from Mill to Foster

Funding

- \$56M American Rescue Plan Act
- \$1M Portland Clean Energy Fund

Construction

2024 – 2026 (2 ½ years)

2+ miles of Repaving 140+ ADA-Compliant Curb Ramps Sidewalk Spot Widening



5 New or Upgraded Traffic Signals



2 New or Upgraded Signalized Pedestrian Crossings



175+ Trees planted in medians and along segments of sidewalk








Community Engagement 2023 - 2024

- Released 30%, 60%, and Draft Final Concept Designs translated into 4 languages
- **5 In-person open houses** with 285+ total participants translators available at each event
- 2 Online surveys with 1,380+ survey responses translated into 4 languages
- Spoke with 250+ businesses during door-to-door canvassing and phone banking
- Met 1-on-1 with 50+ property owners/businesses
- Participated in 18 meetings with associations and organizations
- Participated in 12 community events and walks
- Sent 31,000+ letters and postcards
- **36 Bi-weekly email updates** to 2,700+ subscribers



Construction Diversity Inclusion Policy (CDIP) Participation

Aspirational Goal: 25% of Hard Construction Costs | Projected: 43%

- Minority participation
 - Aspirational Goal: 16% | Projected: 31%
- Women participation
 - Aspirational Goal: 8% | Projected: 15%

Regional Workforce Equity Agreement (RWEA):

- **Utilization of journey-level workers:** Minority: 23%, Women: 10%
- Utilization of apprentices: 20%
