**EXCEEDED:** 399 Units




# **Project Highlights**

- 222 new units of affordable housing (224 units total)
- First Federal Transit
   Administration (FTA) Joint
   Development Agreement (JDA)
   in Portland
- Hollywood neighborhood
- Excellent location near transit, grocery, and other amenities
- 99-year affordability period



#### **Unit Mix**

- 222 units (plus 2 manager's units)
  - 43 studios
  - 53 1-BRs
  - 95 2-BRs
  - 33 3-BRs
- 71 at 30% AMI
- 151 at 60% AMI
- 55 units have rental subsidy from Project Based Vouchers



# Amenities & Contracting

- Community rooms, community kitchen, private meeting space, and entry circulation plaza
- Transit oriented project Hollywood Transit Center
  - 1,200 sf retail space
- Earth Advantage Gold
- 30% DMWESB contracting goal
- Construction: October 2024 through Winter 2026

#### Hacienda Community Development Corp. (Hacienda CDC)

- Family Site Services
- Community Building Activities, Youth Programming and Adult/Employment Education
- Partnerships with Northeast Community Center, Hollywood Senior Center, Portland Opportunities Industrialization Center, the Urban Gleaners, and Immigrant and Refugee Community Organization



### **City Council Request**

- Authorize up to \$33,000,000 in Portland Bond and HOME-ARP funding to BRIDGE Housing or an affiliate
- Authorize the Director of PHB to approve amendments and execute any related documents necessary to advance the project within the maximum approved amounts
