1. Independent Police Review (IPR) Work Plan / Accomplishments

IPR Staff Training

IPR attended training on Communicating with Distressed Individuals presented by Brad Taylor Group. The training addressed strategies of working with folks who may be experiencing stress or trauma. The training also covered the importance of self-care, and strategies of self-care.

Community Outreach

IPR Senior Community Outreach Coordinator Irene Konev attended, networked and recruited volunteers to serve on the Police Review Board at the 2019 Portland Women's Expo, The Pitch and at Elders in Action and met with City of Portland Tribal Relations Director. Konev, IPR Investigator Vince Elmore and CRC member Vadim Mozyrsky attended and presented the IPR commendation/complaint process to the attendees of the Kennedy School Race Talks. Investigator Elmore also presented the IPR program to youth and administrators at Wilson High School through the Word is Bond "Know Your Rights Session" and attended the PCCEP February meeting.

CRC Dialogue

In partnership with Oregon's Law Enforcement Contacts Policy and Data Review (LECC), the CRC Crowd Control Workgroup is planning a Community Dialogue on Police Crowd Control Practices. In small group dialogues, the CRC will be hearing from the community members on four specific topics related to crowd control: equipment use, de-escalation tactics, bias towards particular groups of protestors and recommendations to the Portland Police Bureau training.

The event takes place at Portland State University, Smith Memorial Student Union, Room 101 on April 10th from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. Public is invited to participate in the dialogue.
