1. Independent Police Review (IPR) Work Plan / Accomplishments

IPR Attends Criminal Justice Commission Stakeholders Meeting

IPR leadership and policy staff traveled to Salem to attend the stakeholders meeting on the first year report on law enforcement stop data that was enacted by House Bill 2355.

Investigators Attend Training with Bureau of Labor & Industry (BOLI)

Several IPR and IA investigators attended a multi-day investigator skills training presented by the State of Oregon's BOLI Civil Rights Division. Trainers and presenters included officials from the US Attorney's Office, Housing and Urban Development, and the Washington State Human Rights Commission, among others.

Citizen Review Committee Recruitment

Interviews were completed in November and the selection committee is currently evaluating the candidates. The candidates will next go to the Auditor for review and training will begin in January.

Outreach

IPR Senior Community Outreach Coordinator Irene Konev networked and engaged with the diverse chambers of commerce to expand awareness of the IPR commendation/complaint process at the Holiday Multi-Mixer Chamber event. She connected with members of the Oregon Native American Chamber, Hispanic Chamber, Asian Pacific American Chamber, Philippine American Chamber, Portland Area Business Association, and the Black American Chamber of Commerce. She also attended the Asian Pacific American Network of Oregon community fair and the Community Conversation on the Portland Police Association Contract Negotiations.
