Director's Report

Independent Police Review (IPR) Work Plan / Accomplishments

IPR Operations During COVID

Due to the ongoing public health crisis, all IPR staff are working remotely. Although the IPR office is closed to in-person visits, investigators are available to accept complaints online, by phone or by mail.

Incoming Cases

IPR has received 191 total community contacts since May 29th. Of those, 113 are related to protests. This is not including several thousand form letters and more general contacts. IPR has opened 51 investigations so far.

Policy Reviews

IPR released a review of PPB's Weapon Flashlight Policy today.

CRC Recruitment

The CRC recruitment had strong community response and IPR received 28 applications. However, given the recent vote by city council to form a new police oversight system, this recruitment is being suspended until we have more clarity around the future of the police accountability process.

Community Outreach

IPR Senior Outreach Coordinator Irene Konev engaged with community and coordinated many meetings to expand awareness of IPR. IPR staff met with community leaders and organizations including: Pastor Hennessey of Vancouver Avenue First Baptist Church, staff of Catholic Charities Housing Transitions Projects, Disability Rights Oregon and program managers of Self Enhancement Inc. An overview of the IPR commendation/complaint process was presented to the Slavic Advisory Council, an interview about IPR was held in Russian language at Access Russian Radio and TV, and IPR director spoke on KBOO radio. IPR staff also attended the Interfaith Peace and Action Collaborative. IPR staff supported and attended the CRC Dialogue on Police Crowd Control Practices and the CRC Forum on Police Oversight and Police Reform.
