Independent Police Review (IPR) Work Plan / Accomplishments

IPR Operations During COVID

Due to the ongoing public health crisis, all IPR staff are working remotely. Although the IPR office is closed to in-person visits, investigators are available to accept complaints online, by phone or by mail. With the recent surge resulting from the Omicron variant, City staff's return to the office has been postponed indefinitely.

Community Outreach

Senior Community Outreach Coordinator Irene Konev attended the Inter-faith Peace and Action Collaborative Meetings and connected with community at Southeast Public Safety Meeting. As a founding member of the Slavic Empowerment Team (City of Portland Diverse and Empowered Employees of Portland) Konev coordinated the fifth annual Slavic and Eastern European Heritage Week proclamation. This proclamation will take place on January 19th at 10:05 am at the Portland City Council meeting.


Equity Training

IPR staff continues equity and results-based accountability trainings along with colleagues in the Auditor's office. In December staff continued training with consultants Erica Bernabei and Theodor Miller of Equity and Results LLC. This training group trained staff over several months to gain practical skills to transform culture by developing a shared language, having open discussions about history and race, identifying measurable outcomes.

Settlement Agreement

The City and DOJ continue to work in mediation on reaching an agreement for next steps on the DOJ's nine proposed remedies to noncompliance with the settlement agreement. The next hearing with Judge Simon has not been scheduled yet.
