## **Key takeaways**

- RFP 3 marks the first funding opportunity under the inaugural Climate Investment Plan.
- The estimated lifetime reduction in greenhouse gas emissions for projects is estimated to be roughly 85,000 metric tons CO2e.\*
- Adjustments to the process enables us to include more community partners and expand the impact of projects.







## PCEF CLIMATE INVESTMENT PLAN





## The Climate Investment Plan (CIP) allocates \$750 million in climate investments over the next five years.

The plan includes allocations to 16 strategic programs, a tree maintenance reserve fund, and to the Community Responsive Grants (RFP 3) program.

Strategic programs may be implemented through partnerships with nonprofit organizations, government entities, or businesses.

Community responsive grants are designed to exclusively invest in projects led by nonprofit organizations.

## **Funding Categories and Allocations**

2023-2028: PCEF will distribute \$750 million across 7 funding categories.

## **Grant review process**

### **Application review**

- Eligibility screening
- Technical review
- Applicant vetting

#### **Scoring criteria**

- Scoring criteria based on project type
- Weighted based on the share of budget allocated to a funding area
- Up to 100 points

### **Scoring panels**

- Three members for each panel
- PCEF Committee members, program staff, subject matter experts
- Diverse, balanced, anti-bias training



**230** applications 200+ hours reviewing 2 staff per application + subject matter experts as needed **1.300+** emails exchanged **21** applications did not pass

#### 2. FINANCIAL REVIEW & ADDITIONAL VETTING

**209** applications **3** references per application **300+** hours reviewing

#### 3. SCORING PANELS

20 panels

members assigned to each panel, diverse representation across all panels

**14** external reviewers, 11 PCEF staff

**35** hours scoring per panel


#### 4. RECOMMENDED PORTFOLIO

71 applications **138** applications did not pass

## **Funding** recommendations

- Grants: 71
  - 65 implementation grants
  - 6 planning grants
- Total funds: \$91.9M
- 85,000 metric tons CO<sub>2</sub>e

#### District 3






## Accountability, measuring, reporting



## Accountability, measuring, reporting

- **Transparency.** Visibility to investments and outcomes.
- Measurement. Programs have key metrics. PCEF dashboard shows program progress.
- **Reporting.** Workplans detail timelines, milestones, and project progress.
- **Evaluation.** PCEF and grantees ensure goals are on track.





## **Accountability in grant management**

- Launched WebGrants
- Quarterly reporting
  - All grants required to complete quarterly project reporting and submit payment documentation
  - Payment documentation for all expenses, reviewed by multiple staff before payment issued
  - Project reporting for all milestones, extensive data collection for all deliverables
  - Workforce and contractor utilization reporting
- Verification and quality assurance (QA)
  - Contracted QA provider
  - Site visits and project verification
    - Project completion confirmation and documentation


