Emergency Ordinance

### \*Pay property damage claim of Hannah Bauman for \$8,599 resulting from a motor vehicle collision involving the Portland Police Bureau

Passed

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Hannah Bauman and the insurer, State Farm Insurance have filed a claim against the City for damages resulting from a motor vehicle collision involving the Portland Police Bureau on March 26, 2024.
2. The claim has been investigated by Risk Management Services. The investigation indicates there is risk the City may be found liable. Therefore, in order to avoid the risk of an adverse jury award, it is prudent to settle the claim at this time.
3. Risk Management Services and the Portland Police Bureau recommend the claim be settled for the total sum of \$8,598.79.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- A. The Mayor and the Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver a check in the amount of \$8,598.79 made payable to State Farm Insurance.
- B. Risk Management Services will execute a payment authorization in the amount set forth in sub-paragraph (A) above.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in order to avoid undue and costly delay in settling this property damage claim; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

An ordinance when passed by the Council shall be signed by the Auditor. It shall be carefully filed and preserved in the custody of the Auditor (City Charter Chapter 2 Article 1 Section 2-122)

### Purpose of Proposed Legislation and Background Information
