

The attached list includes the name, address, and a brief statement of purpose of the principal Committees, Agencies, and Commissions concerned with promoting a better way of life for all citizens in the Portland Metropolitan Area.

Each one has been classified by Area, Function (operating or planning) and source of funds. Under Area, City Greater (C+) indicates a metropolitan scope rather than confinement to the City Limits (C). City Lesser (C-) indicates interest in a localized area within the City Limits.

Under funding, Local (L) indicates City or County financing. Federal, State, or Private funds are designated by an F, S, or P.

The accompanying chart indicates areas of overlapping or duplication of effort. It may be desirable at a later date to add the category of Health and Welfare. An analysis of the list and chart may prove helpful in coordinating and developing community-wide participation on the part of both individuals and representative citizens' organizations. Hopefully it also will aid in consolidation of effort and elimination of duplication through the expansion of the Citizens' Committee to include representatives of these groups.
