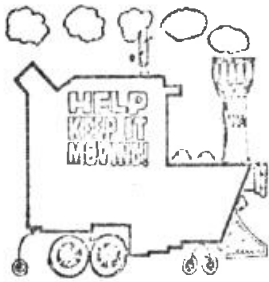
Recommendation:

Agenda:

The agenda was amended to read: Number VIIa, Recommendation of Citizens Planning Board Executive Committee to extend the filing date for Model Cities Election to September 18, 1970, and Number IXa, Mrs. Strong wanted to comment on the recommendation for the zone change at Northeast 17 Avenue and Dekum Street.

The agenda was approved as amended.

The minutes were amended to read: Mr. Gustafson alerted the Board that he would ask for a recommendation on Housing Authority of Portland, and Mrs. Strong asked if Portland Development Commission is utilizing the Freedom Bank of Finance. August 26, 1970 is the deadline for filing applications to become a member of the Citizens Planning Board, instead of September 26, 1970.

The minutes were approved as amended.

Mrs. Diana Davis presented the Youth Opportunity School proposal. Page fifteen was corrected to read: Bus rental \$150.00 per trip, instead of two persons.

It was moved and seconded that the Youth Opportunity School proposal be accepted as amended. Motion carried.

Mr. Al Dvorak, Chairman of the Economic Development and Transportation Committee presented the Contractors Management proposal. There was some debate. Mr. Rogers moved to end debate. Seconded. Motion carried.

Mrs. Bobbie Nunn moved to accept the proposal as presented. Seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. Nathan Nickerson, Director of Project STAR, presented the STAR proposal.

It was moved and seconded that the proposal be accepted. Mr. Herb Simpson asked that it be noted that Mr. Thomas Wilson voted no on this proposal.

Mr. Harry Ward moved to adopt the amendment, Supplement to Urban Renewal Plan, Woodlawn ND Project and the supplement to Urban Renewal Plan, Irvington ND Project.

It was moved by Mr. E. J. Baskett that the filing date be extended to September 18, 1970. The motion was seconded and passed. Discussion followed. There was a motion to end debate. Mr. Thomas Wilson gave a report on the Freedom Bank, there was some discussion. Mr. Chalmers Jones suggested that a study be done on each individual contract.

PROCEDURE FOR POLL WORKERS

MODEL CITIES ELECTION FOR REPRESENTATIVE TO CITIZENS PLANNING BOARD

Swearing of Workers

All workers should be sworn and should sign the Poll Book cover. Workers administer the oath to each other. If the appropriate space on the Poll Book cover is full, worker may sign on the reverse side.

Voter Qualifications

Qualifications are:

- (a) Fourteen years of age; and
- (b) Resident of the appropriate model neighborhood.

Proof

The voter's statement is sufficient proof of his age and address, unless challenged by the Poll Worker or some other person with specific knowledge.

Check the address of each voter to determine if he is in the model neighborhood. If there are questions about the address, call 288-6923.

Procedure

(a) Worker asks voter's address and in appropriate cases asks if he is fourteen years of age.

(b) Worker checks the address to determine if it is within the neighborhood.

(c) Voter signs the appropriate page in the Poll Book and prints his name and address.

(d) The Poll Book is tabbed alphabetically. It is not necessary to

alphabetize the voters whose last names begin with the same letter, i.e. Brown may be before Baker.

(e) Worker gives voter the ballot and directs him to the voting place.

(f) Voter marks a ballot, folds it, and drops it into the ballot box.

(g) As the voter places the ballot in the box, the poll worker checks his name off in the Poll Book.

(h) If the voter makes a mistake on the ballot, the worker should mark it void and place it in the ballot box and give the voter another ballot.

General Instructions

(a) The number of voters with ballots at any one time should be limited to the spaces available at the voting place. Do not let lines form after receiving the ballot. All lines should be prior to the receipt of the ballot.

(b) No one may leave the voting place with his ballot.

(c) Do not let the New Careers Voter Registration booth interfere with your voting procedures.

(d) Allow anyone to observe you as long as he doesn't interfere with your work or annoy you.

(e) Allow examination of the Poll Books; but books are not to be removed from poll workers' desk.

(f) If there are any problems, including harassments, call the Model Cities office 288-6923. Someone will be there all day to help you.

(g) Use of school phones is limited to poll workers.

Closing Polls

- (a) Allow anyone to vote who is in line at 8:00 p.m.
- (b) Seal the ballot box with the tape seals and all workers then on duty will sign the seals.
- (c) Deliver the ballot box and other materials to the election worker who will deliver them to the Model Cities offices.

COUNTING PROCEDURES

The women from the League of Women Voters will break the seal on the ballot box. There will be two tellers, one reader and one person watching the reader. As the reader reads the ballot aloud, the tellers independently enter the marks for the appropriate candidate. After tallying the ballots the canvassers sign the talley sheet and return the ballots and the talley sheets to the ballot box and reseal it. The counters will be sworn and sign the statement sheets. The counters also will sign the talley sheets.

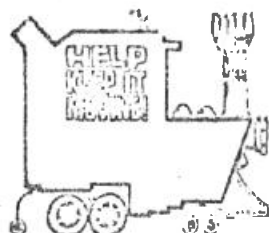

Agenda:

It was moved by Mr. Wilson that the Election Report be moved to Item IV on the Agenda. Seconded. Motion carried.

The Minutes were approved.

Report of Election Committee:

Mr. Lee D. Kell, Chairman, introduced Mr. Ray Coffman, Chairman of the Election Committee. Mr. Coffman made a brief comment concerning the Report.

It was noted that the Report (item I) should be changed to show twenty-seven (27) instead of twenty-eight (28) candidates, since one withdrew.

It was moved by Mrs. Strong to strike out the provision for write-in candidates. Seconded. Mr. Wilson asked for a roll call vote. 10-No, 6-Yes and 1-abstaining. Motion failed.

It was moved by Mr. Jones to rule out proxies, unless they are in writing. Motion ruled out of order by Chair.

It was moved by Mr. Wilson to have only eight (8) polling places and not have Model Cities as the ninth polling place for absentee balloting and to make this action retro-active in order to cover absentee ballots already received by the Model Cities office. Seconded. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Baskett to ratify the boundaries of Eliot and Irvington as shown on the map - to extend East on San Rafael and South on 7th Avenue to Broadway. Seconded. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mrs. Norman to accept the Election Report as amended. Mrs. Cocan amended the motion to show that a provision should be made to enable students to vote by absentee ballots to homes, since there will be no ninth polling place. Seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. Kell announced that a meeting would be held on October 8, 1970, to develop priorities for the Second Action Year programs.

It was moved by Mr. Baskett to approve all projects listed on the Agenda - STAR, Pre-School Expansion, Timmy School, Portland Childrens Center, and Educational Aides - for Second Action Year funding. A motion was amended by Mrs. Jones to accept all of the proposals with the exception of Educational Aides, until such time as an evaluation of this project has been completed. It was further amended by Mr. Jones to have the project evaluation brought back to the Board within a time limit not to extend October 8, 1970. Seconded. Motion carried.

A motion was made to adjourn. Seconded. Motion failed.

A request was made by Mrs. Clara Peoples, that when the Working Committees pass proposals they should not lay around in the Model Cities Office. An original copy should be placed in the files by a reliable person. Copies of the proposal should be given to the Director. Copies should only be given to the Chairman of the Working Committee and persons who worked on it, and should not be given to any one who did not work on the proposal.

It was moved by Mr. Ward to adopt contents of report made by Personnel Hiring Committee. Seconded. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mrs. Cocan to have a letter drawn up from the Citizens Planning Board to the appropriate Committee in H.D. regarding the delay in approval of the Multi-Service Center proposal. This letter is to be written by the Model Cities Agency. Seconded. Motion carried.

A motion was made to adjourn. Seconded. Motion carried.

1970 Election Committee

The 1970 Election Committee has been meeting at least once a week since it was activated, including one meeting at the office of John Weldon, Department of Records and Elections, in Portland.

The following items represent accomplishments to date:

I. List of Candidates

There have been twenty-eight (28) applications filed and certified, representing the areas as follows:

II. Publicity

A. To date:

1. Model Cities Director Charles Jordan's news conference of August 12, 1970 was covered by the local TV stations, and film clips shown that evening during regular newscasts. Articles also appeared the next day in both the Oregonian and the Oregon Journal. Most radio stations gave a summary of Mr. Jordan's remarks in their newscasts.
2. Flyers were circulated and posters have been placed in businesses, houses, schools, churches, government and social agency offices throughout the Model Cities areas. Announcements were made at church programs.
3. Posters have been placed on the trunks of Rose City taxicabs and will be kept in place until after election day September 26, 1970.
4. A major article will be in the Portland Model Cities Newsletter to be distributed during the week of September 20. News articles will be in the Clark Press papers circulated during the week.
5. During the week daily press releases will be issued to the two daily papers, and to all TV and radio stations in the

Portland area.

6. Each candidate will be furnished, at no cost to him, 1,000 flyers for distribution in his area.
7. Flyers specifically noting polling places and polling hours will be distributed throughout the Model Cities area by the end of the week.
8. Model Cities Neighborhood Organizations have been affording candidates an opportunity to appear at meetings and speak on behalf of their candidates.

III. Polling Sites

1. A permit for the use of each of the eight (8) schools on election day has been obtained from Portland School District No. 1, including janitorial service and furniture.
2. Each area will provide the workers to man its poll on election day. The League of Women Voters will monitor the polling places, and will canvas the votes at the Model Cities office immediately after the polls close at 8:00 p.m.
3. Model Cities Office at 5239 N. E. Union Avenue will be a ninth polling site for absentee ballot voting. Ballots will be supplied upon request to voters of the eight school areas, and upon return to the office will be filed in a sealed ballot box. These votes will be canvassed along with the regular ballots from the eight (8) school polling sites.

IV. Ballots

1. Each area will be furnished ballots listing the certified candidates for that area, plus a space for write-in candidate names.
2. Completed ballots will be deposited in sealed ballot boxes at each polling site, and the sealed boxes will be delivered to the Model Cities office for canvassing immediately after the close of polls at 8:00 p.m.

V. Transportation

Voters requiring transportation to their polling sites on election day may call Model Cities Office phone 288-6923. Several cars and two vans will be available for this service.

Model Cities has asked for our help at the voting places. They need people to be monitors or observers. I am asking each staff person to give at least four hours time this Saturday. Here are the assignments:


