

In response to our telephone conversation of October 3, 1969 and your request for information which lends itself to possible appointment to the Model Cities Board; I submit the following.

As you know, Mr. Glenn Jackson, Chairman of the Board of Pacific Power & Light Company, was appointed as Metropolitan Chairman of the National Alliance of Businessmen by President Johnson in 1967 and re-appointed by President Nixon in 1969.

Because of my previous interest and activity in urban development, Mr. Jackson made my services available, full time, for six months to work toward the goals of the Alliance. These goals led to personally contacting more than 350 companies, with 50 employees or more, to encourage their hiring the disadvantaged unskilled worker. It was also part of my job to aid the employer in applying for Federal funds and in this regard I attended a training session held by the U. S. Department of Labor. (See attached agenda.) Related activities included working with state agencies, training centers, and on occasion speaking to various groups. I served as a speaker, for example, on a panel which was moderated by your Al Batiste.

Mr. Casson should be continued as he is a valuable member of the Board.
- Mrs. Arnold (Elaine) Cogan, 6436 S. E. Morrison - Appointed March 1968.  
Mrs. Cogan is very active and an excellent influence. She shows great understanding. Should remain on the Board.
- Mr. John Gustafson, 6522 S. E. 32nd Avenue - Appointed March 1968.  
Mr. Gustafson represents labor, always takes a moderate position.  
Should remain on the Board.
- Mrs. Hazel G. Hays, 3016 N. E. 14th Avenue - Appointed June 24, 1969.  
Hazel Hays is very active, however, community feels there is a conflict of interests and in addition to this there is considerable friction and will continue to be so as long as the present director remains. When the time is appropriate she should be replaced.

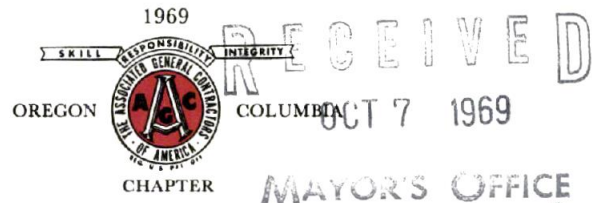

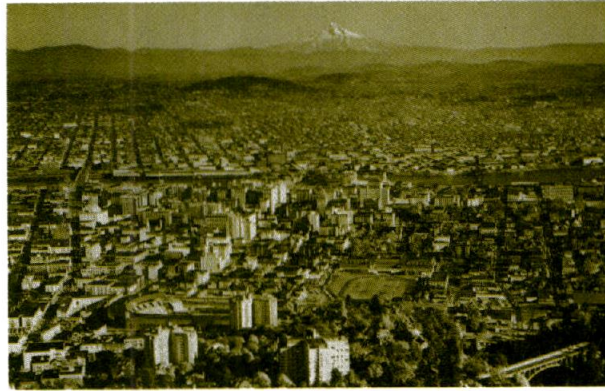

As you will recall, the Citizens Planning Board for the Model Cities Program is made up of 16 elected members and 11 appointed members.


Elections were held recently for one half the elected positions, and a staggered term of office was established.



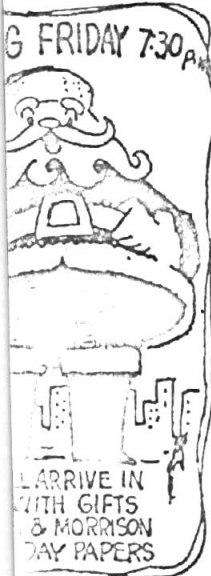

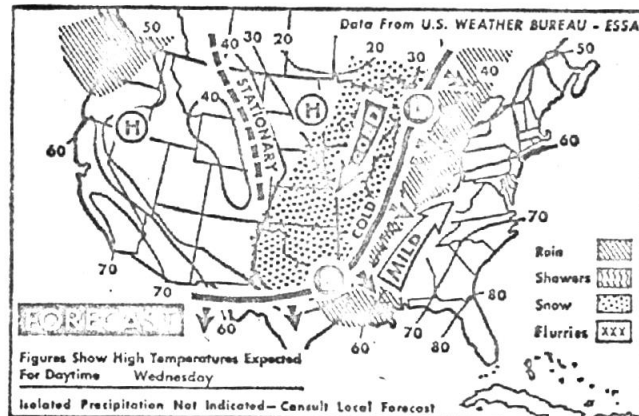

The firm that launders the towels is checking to see if they are disintegrating because of treatment given them by the commercial laundry.

Principal Don Rees reported to the school board last week that the towels were "disintegrating before our eyes" as if the fabric had been doused in acid.

Since then, numerous residents of Lane County have suggested possible explanations. One caller, a woman from Eugene, told Rees that one of her friends had used a powerful new detergent that actually wiped out several sheets and towels.

A commercial laundryman said modern fabrics are so absorptive that it's difficult to get liquid out by normal means especially when it has been washed with the new soaps that have enzymes.

# Stubborn Black Merchandiser Finds Simon-Pure Product Line

A new black enterprise is testing its wings in Portland.

Distribution Enterprises is headed by Roy Holloway, a Western-garbed entrepreneur, also active in the Community Care Program, Model Cities Planning Board and the Albina Police Community Relations Board. It has eight shareholders.

Holloway has three things in mind. He wants to get black-labeled products into white stores, raise the standard of living for blacks, and at the same time ease racial hostilities.

"IF BLACKS see goods in the stores that are completely produced by blacks they will be convinced they have a part in the overall economy," is the way Holloway sees things.

However, getting the business launched wasn't as easy as one might think. Holloway's self-imposed rules are strict. When he says black-produced goods he means right from top management down.

Armed with \$8,000 he collected from interested citizens, Holloway set out for San Francisco and Oakland. He found lots of enterprises that were managed by blacks but either were funded by the U.S. government or by whites. A trip to Seattle had the same results.

He returned to Portland, started asking questions of acquaintances and found leads on completely black firms in the East. Two likely prospects in Illinois went sour as Holloway traced the corporate chain.

PENNSYLVANIA proved to be the pot of gold, as Holloway located three minority-run companies that could meet his rigid standards. One company is a public corporation, another is a private black company and the third is run by a Chicano.

So now Distribution Enterprises had a product line for its 1634 NE Alberta St. showroom and office family. Mau mau wigs, "big sellers back East where they add to the 'ridiculous look' which is growing in popularity"; African style clothing, especially the disheka (a colorful loose-fitting garment that hangs below the knees), and furniture (living room, bedroom) flowed into the warehouse.

Fred Meyer was the first business to come forward. In fact, the Meyer organization had provided some of the original \$8,000 seed money. Meyer not only placed the first order, he offered to assist in product development for black manufacturers.

J. C. Penney has approved an initial purchase and is testing the products.

"We're waiting for a decision from Meier & Frank, and G. I. Joe has bought the whole line," Holloway said happily. "We have to go carefully, there aren't enough supplies at the moment."

AS FOR direct sales, Holloway doesn't mince words. "We know who's jivin'. There will be those with long lips and tongue we'll have to sort out. There is no denying that we have some people who have become social leeches because of improper management of school handouts."

Holloway grew up in Oklahoma. His mother was unable to look after her four boys and work as a housemaid, too. A childless white rancher took them in.

The big Irishman was a strict disciplinarian, and didn't spare the rod. "We didn't like it at the time but have since realized that he was preparing us for the tough road ahead of us.

"After I left I was in and out of trouble for a while — fighting and the like. Then I realized I was wasting my potential and went through a self-examination period. The religious background instilled by my mother and the discipline provided by the Lawton, Okla., rancher gave me something with which to draw comparisons.

"YOU SEE, that's the problem with ghetto kids — they can't see their background as it relates to their future. All-black products in the stores will give them a success factor to identify with.

"Sure I could be used or taken advantage of. Anybody would be a fool to think otherwise. I'm willing to be used by anyone if it will advance my people.

"When blacks see our goods in the store it will stimulate individual creativity."

What if Distribution Enterprises fails?

"It can't fail. Nothing good can fail, something good would grow from it.

"Myself, I've got a feeling it will go big."

The Woodlawn Improvement Association realizes that only a short time remains before your selection of new appointees to the Model Cities Citizens Planning Board. However, due to circumstances of which we were unaware until last evening, the Association wishes to submit one name for your consideration, the name of Josiah J. Nunn.

At the September 21, 1971 meeting of the Model Cities Citizens Planning Board, it was decided that two Board members who have moved outside the areas from which they were elected would be ineligible to complete the remainder of their terms. RULES AND OPERATING PROCEDURE OF THE  
CITIZENS PLANNING BOARD OF THE  
MODEL CITIES PROGRAM

I  
OFFICE

The office of the Citizens Planning Board, hereinafter referred to as the Board, shall be located at 5329 N.E. Union Avenue, Portland, Oregon, 97211.

II  
MEMBERS

1. Composition

(a) The Board shall consist of 27 members selected as follows:

(i) Each of the following eight (8) elementary school attendance areas shall elect two (2) representatives who shall be residents of the area from which they are selected:

Boise	Eliot
Humboldt	King
Irvington	Sabin
Vernon	Woodlawn

(ii) The Mayor of the City of Portland shall appoint the balance of the members.

2. Vacancies

(a) If any elected member of the Board is unable for any reason to serve on the Board, then the Board, upon the recommendation of the neighborhood organization, shall temporarily fill the vacancy until the next regular Board election.

(b) If any appointed member of the Board is unable for any reason to serve on the Board, then the Board shall recommend a person or persons to the Mayor for his consideration for appointment to fill out the unexpired term of said appointed member.

*Proposed*



3. g. Absences

If any elected member of the Board misses three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the Board, his Neighborhood Organization will be notified of said fact. The Neighborhood Organization, upon recommendation to the Board, shall temporarily fill the vacancy until the next regular Board election. The replacement may at that time file as a candidate for the vacancy.

4. B. Conflicts of Interests

Any person working directly for any project or program of the Model Cities Agency shall refrain from voting when his Agency's interest is before the Board. If contested, a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present will determine conflict of interest.

5. Elections and Appointments

(a) Time

An election shall be held annually, on the last Saturday of September, with the first election to be held on the last Saturday of September, 1968. In addition to Board members, any other elective office under the Model Cities Program may be filled at such elections.

(b) Eligibility

A person shall be eligible to vote in said election if said person is (1) a resident of the Model Cities area, and (2) at least 14 years of age on or before the date of the election.

(c) Administration

For each regular and special election, the Board shall appoint an election committee, composed of not less than one (1) representative from each school attendance area, to work with the League of Women Voters for the purpose of supervising and administering the elections.

(d) First and Second Elections Only

(i) For the first election, position No. 2 (that position which received the second highest number of votes in the initial election held on March 2, 1968) for each school attendance area shall be open for election. Position No. 1 (that position which received the highest number of votes in said initial election) from each school attendance area shall be open for election the following year.

- (ii) Six (6) of the appointed positions shall be open for appointment by the Mayor of the City of Portland on or about the time set for the first election. The balance of the appointed positions shall be open for appointment by the Mayor on or about the time set for the election in the following year.

6. Term

The term of office for members shall be two years except in the event of a vacancy. The replacement shall serve until the next regular Model Cities election, at which time the position will be declared vacant and open for election. In the event, two (2) seats are vacant, one shall have a one (1) year term and one shall have a two (2) year term based on being numbered (1) and (2).

7. Residency

When an elected member moves from his school attendance area, his position becomes vacant. This vacancy is to be temporarily filled by the Board upon recommendation from the recognized Neighborhood Organization at the Neighborhood Organization's next regular meeting. The replacement shall serve until the next regular Model Cities Board election, at which time the position will be declared vacant.

III  
OFFICERS

1. Officers

The officers of the Board shall be the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Second Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Corresponding Secretary.

2. Election

The officers of the Board shall be elected by the Board.

- (a) Elections shall be held at the last regular meeting in the month of November or at the earliest date convenient to the Board.

3. Removal

Any officer of the Board may be removed from his office for cause by the Board. Any officer of the Board may be removed by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present if there are twenty-three (23) members present. Voting will be done by secret ballot.

FOR CAUSE

4. Term

All officers of the Board shall serve a one-year term beginning from the date of their election or until their successors have been duly elected and qualified. No officer shall serve in the same office for more than one term.

5. Vacancies

A vacancy in any office for any reason shall be filled by the Board for the unexpired portion of the term.

IV  
DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Chairman

The Chairman shall preside at the meetings of the Board and shall be the chief administrative officer of the Board.

2. Vice-Chairman and Second Vice-Chairman

The Vice-Chairman and Second Vice-Chairman, in the order ~~of~~ <sup>NAMED</sup> seniority, shall in the absence or disability of the Chairman, exercise the powers and perform the duties of the Chairman. The Vice-Chairman and Second Vice-Chairman shall also exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as shall be prescribed by the Board or by the Chairman or by these Rules and Operating Procedure.

3. Secretary

The Secretary shall keep or have kept under his direction an accurate record of the activities of the Board, including minutes of all meetings of the Board, which records shall be preserved and available to any member upon reasonable request. The Secretary shall be responsible for notifying members of the time and place of all meetings.

4. ~~Assistant~~ Corresponding Secretary

~~The Corresponding Secretary shall handle all correspondence of the Board, both incoming and outgoing, under the direction of the Chairman. The Corresponding Secretary shall, in the absence or disability of the Secretary, exercise the powers and perform the duties of the Secretary. He shall also exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board or by the Chairman.~~

## V MEETINGS

### 1. Regular Meetings

Regular meetings of the Board shall be held on the first and third Tuesday of each month. All regular meetings of the Board shall begin promptly at 7:30 p.m. and every attempt shall be made to adjourn not later than 10:00 p.m.

### 2. Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Board may be called for any purpose by the Chairman or by any five (5) members who make such request in writing to the Executive Committee. Notice of special meetings shall be given by or at the direction of the Chairman or the Executive Committee to each member not less than 24 hours prior to the time set for the meeting, either personally or by mail. The Executive Committee shall, upon proper request, call a special meeting within 48 hours after receiving such request.

### 3. Public Meeting

All regular meetings of the Board and of the working committees shall be open to the public.

(a) All executive and standing committees meetings of the Citizens Planning Board are exempt from this regulation at their discretion.

### 4. Place of Meetings

Regular Board Meetings shall be held at Cascade Center as long as facilities are available or at a place designated by the Chairman.

### 5. Quorum

At any meeting of the Board, fourteen (14) of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

### 6. Majority Rule

All questions and votes shall be decided by a majority of the votes cast at any meeting of the Board, except those provisions where two-thirds (2/3) vote is required.

### 7. Right to be Heard

Governed by Roberts Rules of Order. Audience participation can be limited to three (3) minutes per person ( 2 pro and 2 con ) at the discretion of the Chairman.



VI  
COMMITTEES

1. Committees

The Board shall have the power to establish committees and to set their composition and duties. A majority of the members of a committee shall constitute a quorum.

2. Standing Committees

In addition to such other committees as the Board may from time to time authorize and the Chairman may appoint (with the Board's approval) there shall be the following standing committees:

- Executive Committee
- Personnel Committee
- Rules Committee

Members of standing committees, except for the Executive Committee, shall be appointed by the Executive Committee and ratified by the Board. Except for the Executive Committee, each standing committee shall elect its own officers. Meetings of the standing committees shall be called by the presiding officer at the convenience of the members.

3. Term

All standing committee members shall hold office for one (1) year from the date of their election or until their successors have been elected and qualified. A person may serve on only one standing committee at a time. No person shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms on any one committee except the Chairman of the Board.

4. Executive Committee

The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Board plus four (4) other members to be elected by the Board. The Chairman of the Board shall be the Chairman of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall call a special meeting of the Board if requested in writing by any five (5) Board members. The Executive Committee between regular meetings of the Board shall represent the Board, provided, however, that any policy action considered by the Executive Committee shall be subject to the approval of the Board at its next meeting.

5. Personnel Committee

The Personnel Committee shall consist of five (5) members of the Board to be appointed by the Executive Committee and ratified by

A. the Board. By authority of the Personnel Hiring Committee the City Demonstration Agency Director is authorized to fill authorized positions until such time as the Personnel Hiring Committee deems it necessary to recommend to the Citizens Planning Board that said authority be revoked.

6. Rules Committee

A. The Rules Committee shall consist of five (5) members appointed by the Executive Committee and ratified by the Board. The Chairman of the Rules Committee will be Parliamentarian of the Citizens Planning Board. The Rules Committee shall meet periodically to review the by-laws to make necessary provisions for change subject to Board ratification and addition.

A. 7. Special Committees

Special committees can be appointed by the Chairman and authorized by the Board when the need arises. Upon completion of their job, a special committee shall be terminated.

VII  
WORKING COMMITTEES

A. 1. In addition to other working committees that the Board may from time to time authorize, the following shall be the working committees of the Model Cities Program:

- A. Citizens Participation
- B. Education
- C. Employment
- D. Economic Development & Transportation
- E. Health Services
- F. Housing & Physical Environment
- G. Law & Justice
- H. Social Services
- I. Recreation & Culture

A. 2. Members

Only residents of the Model Cities area may be voting members of any committee. The exception to this is Board members who reside outside the Model Cities area.

A. 3. Officers

Each working committee shall have a chairman and such other officers as deemed necessary by the working committee. The duties of the chairman shall correspond with the duties of the Chairman of the

Board. The chairman shall be a resident of the Model Cities area and shall be elected by the committee. Each working committee chairman shall be an advisory member of the Board. Board members cannot hold offices on working committees.

4. Sub-Committees

Working committees may form sub-committees for any purpose.

5. Voting Rights

~~All members of a working committee shall have the right to vote.~~

5. Rules and Operating Procedures

All working committees are subject to the rules and operating procedures as set forth by the Model Cities Citizens Planning Board working committees' policies and procedures.

VIII  
AMENDMENTS

A These rules and operating procedures of the Citizens Planning Board may be altered, amended or repealed and new rules and operating procedures adopted by the Board at any regular meeting of the Board after the proposed changes have been read at two successive regular meetings, except when these Rules and Operating Procedures conflict with city, state, or Federal policies. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board is necessary to pass any amendment.

IX  
RULES OF ORDER

A At all meetings of the Board, Roberts Rules of Order shall govern unless in conflict with these Rules and Operating Procedures.





Pastor Edgar L. Jackson was born in Martin Ferry, Ohio on September 16, 1895. He was Pastor at All Nations Nazarene Church for 14 years, after which he became Pastor of All Nations Community Church for 7 years; without salary and suffering many times in order to help other members of the congregation.

Pastor Edgar L. Jackson lived his Christian life by serving God through serving his neighbors. He was instrumental in serving with many Community Organizations long before government programs began. He was found trying to meet the needs of those who were less fortunate than he. He not only wore a suit on Sunday, but often times found himself in coveralls, helping to meet needs where he found them.

He served on the original War on Poverty Committee, on the Model Cities Committee, Metropolitan Steering Committee, Police Community Relations, Eliot Neighborhood Community Association and he served as Secretary for the Albina Ministerial Alliance. He was instrumental in getting the first black man hired in the Fred Meyer Corporation.

His life touched the lives of not only those who were members of his church, but also the common man on the street. He served for 4 years on the Welfare Commission, but also touched the lives of City Commissioners, Mayors, Governors and Senators.

Rev. Jackson was very dedicated to the Adult Senior Citizens Program. He was the originator and helped to organize this program and then served as Director of the Handy Man Department after it was organized. It was through his efforts that many Senior Citizens are receiving Outreach Counseling, Food, Care, and Jobs through this program. He also helped to organize Life Center which is still serving the needs of people in this area.

He departed this life April 4, 1972 at 4:10 A.M. He leaves to mourn, his devoted wife, Patricia Jackson, 3 older sons, Clifford of Dayton, Ohio, Ronald of Cleveland, Ohio and Jonathan of Portland, Oregon; 3 Step-Children, Jennifer and Greg of Portland, Oregon and Michael of Albany, Oregon; 1 Sister, Alethia Smith of Rockford, Illinois; 1 brother, 2 Grand Children and a host of relatives and friends.

Pastor Jackson, as he was known to Albina residents, was born in Martin Ferry, Ohio, Sept. 16, 1895. He came to Portland about 22 years ago and started All Nations Nazarene Church. Seven years ago he changed the name to All Nations Community Church.

He was an officer of the Albina Ministerial Alliance, the Eliot Neighborhood Association, and several Model Cities committees. He is survived by his wife Patricia; sons, Clifford, of Dayton, Ohio; Ronald, of Cleveland, Ohio, and Jonathan, of Portland; stepsons, Gregory James, of Portland, and Michael James, of Albany; stepdaughter, Jennifer James, of Portland; a sister, Alethia Smith, of Rockford, Ill.; a brother, name and address unknown; two grandchildren and several great-grandchildren.
