REPORT ON PROBATIONARY TEACHER

Name of Teacher Marjorie Shapiro Temporary Probationary Year Subject or grade Pre-school

Name of School Early Childhood Education I have observed this teacher's work on A occasions. The average length of my observations was approximately 30 minutes. I have conferred with the teacher on several occasions.

I have made the following suggestions for improvement:

Mrs. Shapiro has shown very limited growth in teaching skills and in providing for the individual differences of the children in her E.C.E. classroom. Although it has been recommended that Mrs. Shapiro take additional training in E.C.E. methods, there has been little evidence to substantiate that she has indeed followed these recommendations.

Housekeeping, as well as personal hygiene, have been very poor and the need for improvement has been discussed with Mrs. Shapiro on many occasions. Except for very short periods immediately following such discussion, no permanent improvement has been observed.

Lesson plans, despite repeated requests from both the supervisors and team leaders have been non-existent. The disorganization, seeming lack of control and limited experiences offered the children in Mrs. Shapiro's classroom would substantiate the inadequacy, if indeed not the total lack of daily lesson plans.

Aides and assistants seem to lack direction and purpose of action, which would indicate they are receiving little guidance from their classroom teacher.

I have found the following evidence of commendable work:

Mrs. Shapiro's attitude toward suggestions and directions from her supervisors is usually one of passive rejection.

Although Mrs. Shapiro had decided that the weather was too bad to allow her to safely arrive at work on inclement weather days, she did not find it severe enough to prevent her on one day from accompanying neighborhood children to the park to play. She was indignant when questioned as to why she neither reported for work or notified her supervisors of her intentions.

COMMENDATIONS:

Mrs. Shapiro is an extremely innovative person with a background of fine arts. When she so desires, Mrs. Shapiro is capable of providing unusually creative and innovative activities for the children in her classroom.

Mrs. Shapiro has the enviable ability to remain cool, calm, and collected when all about her is chaotic.

If this teacher's work continues to be of its present quality, I (shall) (shall not) recommend election for another year of service in School District No. 1.

Dear Dr. Taylor:

This letter is a reply to the Temporary Teacher Report on myself, Marjorie Shapiro, submitted by Lee DeLance and Martha B. Jordan, directors of Early Childhood Education. The report is dated 2-21-73. I wish this letter placed in my file as a rebuttal to that report.

I have been a teacher in the Early Childhood Program for four years. I was an assistant teacher in E.C.E. for one year before becoming a teacher. The enclosed evaluation is the only written evaluation that I have received in the total five years of my employment. I find the evaluation to be erroneous, misleading and an unfair summation of my performance.

Until January of 1973, I had not been informed that my teaching skills and classroom offerings were grossly inadequate. The curriculum teacher (designated as "team leader" in the report) had visited my room approximately once a week. Her usual comment was, "Everything is just fine.". I constantly evaluated myself by keeping notes on the children's progress and their enthusiasm. I believed my classroom to be interesting, exciting and appropriate to the children's needs.

Miss DeLance visited my classroom once last year. Mrs. Jordan accompanied her. They stayed approximately fifteen minutes and observed the end of a guided play time segment. Mrs. Jordan visited two more times during this same time of day for approximately five to ten minutes. First, I feel that these visits were too short to make such destructive criticisms. Second, these visits only showed one part of my daily schedule, which also included small group instructional activities, music time, story time, outside play and the children's participation in

and enjoyment of snack and lunch. I also included many other activities to enrich our daily schedule. Third, these visits came after an abrupt change of assistant teachers. Without notice, discussion or explanation, the assistant I had worked with during summer and fall was sent to another classroom. The new assistant was of a considerably different personality and age. The children and I were making adjustments to this change. The new assistant was also adjusting to us as her previous experience had been in Day Care centers.

I have always had a high interest in improving the learning quality of my classroom and improving my effectiveness as a teacher. My college degree is in fine arts, but I also have forty-two (42) hours in education. I constantly and consistently seek information on my own and from other teachers. I have found many ideas and materials from college and public libraries, book stores and educational toy catalogues. I have taken eighteen (18) hours of classes while in E.C.E. Fifteen (15) of those hours were method classes. I was interested in taking more but tuition costs and family responsibilities made this prohibitive. Much to my disappointment the E.C.E. staff meetings conducted by the supervisors were usually void of helpful information. Only at the teachers' insistence was a limited sharing time made available. I had been encouraged to obtain a teaching certificate but never was it mentioned to me to take classes because of inadequate teaching skills.

During the school year of 1971-72, Miss DeLance advised me that I needed to take more care with my appearance. She said that parents had complained, "especially the black parents, who expect so much more from us". During that year, of twenty children I had only two black children and contact with only two black parents. With both of these parents I had good rapport. They indicated support and interest in our classroom. I rejected Miss DeLance's statement as racial and confused. That was the only time I can recall being advised in any way about personal hygiene. I considered myself appropriately dressed for work with young children which to me includes being clean and neat. I am willing to consider that in my zeal for improving the classroom and helping children I may have mixed up my priorities and spent too little time or money on myself. But there is also something to be said about being overdressed in a poverty program. This past year I have donated money for childrens shoes and spent much of my salary for classroom materials. Many materials I felt important to the educational experience of my children were apparently not included in Head Start funding. During the year I bought books, records, games, unusual foods, food coloring, camera film and processing, small animals with cages and animal food, plants, seeds, bulbs, doll clothing, yarns, a foam pad to go underneath the outside climber to break hazardous falls onto the asphalt,

and resin materials so I could encase small insects for handling and observing.

I am enclosing letters from two parents, a former assistant and a community volunteer. I feel these letters will reflect my contention that I had adequate lesson plans, I worked carefully with the adults in the classroom, there was control and direction in the classroom, there was a large variety of experiences provided and all children were planned for and their individual needs taken into account. I also have additional supportive letters from teachers and assistants now working in the E.C.E. program. After much deliberation, and consideration of the personalities of the supervisors, I did not include those letters due to concern that it might subject them to the kinds of harrassment and subtle intimidation that I have myself experienced.

It is entirely ridiculous that I provided children limited experiences. After five years of working in Head Start I am well aware of it's preschool goals. Daily, weekly and monthly I planned for and encouraged a balanced growth in areas of language, math, perceptual and conceptual skills, science, social science, motor skills, music and art. While providing for mental and physical skills I also included emotional and social development. My assistant and I planned together to help each child develop healthy attitudes towards himself, his peers and the adult world. It was my purpose to explore these learning areas actively, thoughtfully and happily. I consistantly used my innovative and creative abilities to do so. Learning was encouraged by a variety of multi-sensory activities. I wish to cite some examples....

1. The children were learning to identify through taste and color the different juices they had at school. Naming and identifying can be a limited experience. To expand experiences such as this I did such things as, on the day we had pineapple juice, I brought a real pineapple and a mechanical juicer. The children individually squeezed their own fresh juice. This became a science, language and even motor skill learning experience. The children were led to talk about the pineapple descriptively, to wonder about its growth and where it came from, to compare fresh juice with canned juice and to talk descriptively about taste. We continued this activity with apples, oranges, tomatoes and grapes.
2. The children were learning to name and identify colors. We used many matching games both commercial and teacher made. But this was not enough. When teaching the color "red" the children finger painted with red paint, made their own play dough and colored it red, made cherry jello, frosted a cookie with red icing, tasted a pomegranate, looked for red in their clothing, look-

ed through red cellophane paper, viewed a filmstrip and pictures relating to that color and took a walk to find red things outside.

3. Two math activities repeated many times and in many ways were counting and sorting. The children learned numerous counting songs. They used the Sterns Kit and Cuisenaire Rods and many teacher and commercial made games. They used science materials as they counted and sorted pine cones, shells, rocks, leaves and wild flowers mounted on cards, seeds, plastic miniature animals and many kinds of nuts (which were later eaten). They counted and sorted themselves as we made sets of boys and girls, or sets of children wearing particular items such as belts, boots, tennis shoes, hair ribbons, etc. The children counted their eyes, ears, elbows, fingers and toes as they also learned to name their body parts.

To guard against a superficial learning experience, I refused to be dependent on one kind of learning activity. If my housekeeping appeared very poor it may have been because there was a great deal going on in our room. Observations which preceded my permanent report appear to have been geared to destructive rather than constructive criticism. These brief, infrequent observations accentuated housekeeping in proportionately to the major needs of the developing child.

The first day of the school year 1972-73 I reported a mouse in the classroom closet. The mouse was not caught and one month later we noticed more mice and rats. Before attacking the rodent problem I was personally attacked as being responsible because of poor housekeeping. In talking with neighbors and former teachers of that center, I realized that there had long been a rodent problem in the neighborhood and in the center. This reinforced my belief that it indeed was not my negligence that had caused the situation.

In working with young children I have always stressed the importance of their participation in snacktime and lunchtime and the resultant learnings gained from this participation. With planned supervision the children would assist in the preparation, serving and clean-up. Since the children had much to do with the room it may not have been perfect but I felt it was reasonably tidy and safely sanitary. However, I did become concerned for the children's health when there were mice and rats in the classroom and later rodent poison behind the refrigerator, in the adult bathroom and in the closet. I asked Miss DeLance to close school for two days before the weekend while the poison and rodents, live and dead, could be removed. She assured me that she was on top of the situation and that there was no danger to the children and no need to close school. The next day I again expressed my concern.

Miss DeLance told me, "If teachers can't take it, they need to stay home and call a substitute!".

With the above kind of frustration compounded by many similiar experiences, I have tended to develop an attitude towards the supervisors of passive rejection. This was a common attitude of many staff members. Some teachers reacted more actively. Some teachers sought outside sources of help. For their efforts they were branded as trouble makers. Some teachers have merely quit.

In the five years of my employment I once failed to report my absence from work. This was an unusual circumstance and not in any way typical of my performance. On January 11, 1973, because of severe weather, schools were closed to students. I live ten miles from school and I felt the travel too hazardous to undertake. From eight o'clock until ten o'clock I tried to reach the E.C.E. office by 'phone to report my absence. But there was no one in the office. I called other teachers who lived near the school and they also did not intend to go out. I called my assistant teacher to let her know that I would not be at school. She had also decided to remain home. In fact, Mrs. Jordan called her and told her to stay home and not risk an injury. After a last unsuccessful attempt to contact the E.C.E. office, I took a group of children across the street to the park. The next morning when questioned by Miss DeLance I explained my day and willingly agreed to have it considered an emergency leave. Miss DeLance was satisfied with this agreement but persisted with what seemed to be a "scolding". If I did express indignation (which is not in keeping with my "enviable cool, calm and collected" nature) it was a reaction to her emotional outburst. It seemed an unnecessary and negative way to start the teaching day. Another teacher, who will remain nameless because she is still with E.C.E., was in the office at this same time. She later volunteered her sympathies to me. It was also her observation that Miss DeLance was behaving out of proportion to the situation. On January 24, a memorandum from Donald McElroy included a statement from Dr. Blanchard, "...In the interest of fairness and because of the existing confusion regarding January 11, 1973, no emergency leave days will be charged against any district employees for that day.". I feel that this verifies the unusualness of that day and supports my position that this incident has no place in a permanent report.

In conclusion, I will miss the joys of working with Head Start children. I will miss seeing the growth in parents as they work with their own children and others in the classroom. I will miss the relationships with parents from which I developed new understandings of people, problems and solutions. However, I recognize my relationship with Miss DeLance and Mrs. Jordan has been very strained. This past year, problems which

should have been handled professionally were met with suspicion, emotionalism and negativism. Although the official decision was initially theirs, it was also my own intention not to return to E.C.E. It is distressing to know that warmth, joy, spontaneity, cooperation, trust and possibly even love of children are endangered qualities in this preschool child program.

As an aid I learned a great deal from Marjorie Shapiro. We would prepare a week at a time, and each evening we would go over and discuss what we would do the next day, what would be best for a certain certain child etc.

I know she put her personal money and a great deal of time in preparing different and challenging skills for the children. I

There was a lot of Science, sewing, working with clay, where the number concepts were brought in. Sculpturing with foam, weights and ballancing. always something that the children learned from and enjoyed.

The cooking was just great. Receipts were made so the children could read themselves, they made raisins, peanut butter, cookies, pan-cakes, salads, soups. The children had the experience of going to the store to purchase what would be made that day. (with Mrs. Shapiro's own money). Each child had his own individual salad etc. to prepare, from the measuring, cutting with careful guidance, they really enjoyed it.

Mrs. Shapiro is such a warm humane person. When a student had problems and was going to drop out of school, Mrs. Shapiro asked if transportation could be provided by the social work crew, she was told 'no'. Mrs. Shapiro saw where school was helping the child very much, so she asked if she could take the child home on her lunch break, she was told 'yes' but if another parent asked she would have to do the same for them. She said O.K. and did give the student a ride home every day.

She brought crab and different things from her own money for the children. And I know she helped some children with clothes.


The times I went to help or pick up my son every thing was very well organized & I hope she keeps teaching, as she's a credit to the teaching profession.
