SUBJECT: PRE-SCHOOL EXPANSION CONTRACT CHARGE REQUEST

Attached is a Contract Change Request from School District No. 1. This request would reallocate \$2,375 from contracted services to space. The items deduced under contracted services are as follows:

- \$1,000 from lunches: this is possible because of recent legislation which gives the school district more funds under the National School Lunch Program.
  - (b) \$1,000 from medical services: this is possible due to the volunteer services of Dr. Hargaret Wayson.
  - (c) \$375 from snack: this is possible also due to additional funds from the National School Lunch Program.

The additional funds for space are necessary to provide for increased space costs and provide adequate space for ninety (90) children. This change also transfers \$225 from contracted services which were for insurance to the insurance category. These funds were already approved as budgeted.

Initially, the City Demonstration Agency had considerable reservations about this requested change. We now feel we have adequate assurance from the School District that the level of services to the children will be maintained and that this change is necessary and beneficial to the project.

# ORDINANCE NO. 134630

An Ordinance amending Contract No. 12883 between the City and School District No. 1 so as to increase the services required under said contract and reduce the City's monetary obligation thereunder, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that as a part of its Model City Program, the City entered into Contract No. 12883 with School District No. 1, Multnomah County, providing for a Preschool Program for the Model Neighborhood; that the City's total obligation under said contract for the Model City Second Action Year (June 16, 1971 to June 15, 1972) is \$81,674; that it is anticipated that there will be a surplus in the amount budgeted for said contract; that 101 Model Neighborhood children are currently enrolled in various outlying school districts (Beaverton, David Douglas, Lake Oswego and Parkrose) as part of the Portland Public Schools Inter Area Cultural Exchange Program; that the cost of transporting said children to the various schools has been borne by School District No. 1 but because of budget problems they are unable to continue paying for such transportation after May 12, 1972; that the children participating in said Inter Area Program are scheduled to continue their schooling until approximately June 9, 1972; that the Model City Citizens Planning Board has recommended that Model City funds be used to pay for the cost of transporting said children through the end of their current school year; that School District No. 1 indicates that it can perform its obligations under Contract No. 12883 (for the period from June 16, 1971 to June 15, 1972) including the transportation of children to outlying school districts for \$77,174; that said contract should be amended to authorize said transportation of children and the City's total obligation under Contract No. 12883 for the Second Action Year (June 16, 1971 to June 15, 1972) should be reduced to \$77,174, thereby releasing \$4,500 for use in other projects; now, therefore, Contract No. 12883 is hereby amended as follows:

(a) The project description attached hereto as Exhibit "A" shall supplement and become a part of Contract No. 12883 and the budget attached hereto as part of Exhibit "A" shall replace the budget currently attached to said contract.

- (b) School District agrees to hold City harmless for any and all claims and demands that may arise or be occasioned to any person or to any property arising from the transportation services provided for in the supplementary project description referred to in (a) above.
- (c) The City's total obligation for all services to be provided under Contract No. 12883 (including the project description mentioned in (a) above) for the Second Action Year (June 16, 1971 to June 15, 1972) is hereby reduced from \$81,674 to \$77, 174.

All other terms and provisions of said contract shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be an effective amendment to Contract No. 12883 upon acceptance of the terms and provisions of this ordinance in writing by School District No. 1, Multnomah County.

Section 3. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that the amendment described in Section 1 hereof may be accomplished without undue delay; therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

#### PROJECT SUMMARY

#### OBJECTIVE

This project is designed to furnish transportation for students who are presently in a full 10-month program and require busing accommodations to complete the regular school year at these outlying schools.

The transportation will be provided for a twenty (20) day period from May 15, 1972 through June 9, 1972.

#### SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION

#### I. PURPOSE AND BENEFICIARIES

#### <u>Purpose</u>

The purpose is to provide transportation to those students, from the Model Neighborhood school, who are registered in a pupil cultural exchange program between the Portland Public Schools and outlying suburban schools, to allow them to complete the full school year of instruction afforded in those schools, and which will not close at the early closure date of the City of Portland Public Schools. The period covered will be from May 15, 1972 through June 9, 1972.

#### Beneficiaries

Those children, 101 in number, who are residents of the Model Meighborhood, and are enrolled in this cultural exchange program. By being afforded this extended busing provision, they will not have to miss one month of instruction, from these schools which are not closing early as in the city of Portland.

#### II. CONTENT AND OPERATION

The functional element of this project is:

Function 1--Provision of transportation

This one function is adequate for securing successful execution of this project. This function will be executed by the Portland Public Schools. The school will provide bus equipment, driver, student supervision, and insurance liability coverage for the children.

The key activities within this project are:

Activity 1-1 Provide buses for transportation

Activity 1-2 Provide bus drivers for transportation

Activity 1-3 Provide for student supervision during transportation

#### III. TIMETABLE

This project will have a duration of one month. It will extend from May 15, 1972 through June 9, 1972. Scheduled activity is indicated on time frame attached. (Attachment #2)

#### IV. FUNDING

Project cost will be \$3,920.00. Total funding will be from HUD supplemental funds.

#### V. PROJECT ADMINISTRATION

This project will be administered by the Portland Public Schools (Area District #1 Office).

#### VI. COORDINATION

This project is coordinated with the following agencies:

Beaverton Public Schools David Douglas Public Schools Lake Oswego Public Schools Parkrose Public Schools

The above listed elementary schools will provide the space, facilities, and instructional teachers for the project. The Portland Public Schools, through this grant, will provide the transportation and student supervision while in transit.

#### VII. MONITORING AND EVALUATION

This project will be subject to the monitoring and evaluation requirements as are specified in the Portland CDA overall Evaluation Plan. The monitoring and evaluation will be on a monthly basis. The reports will be recorded on special reporting forms supplied by the CDA Evaluation Unit.

Financial reimbursement, for the execution of the project, will be based upon the timely receipt of these reports. These reports will be due into the CDA, from the Operating Agency, by the <u>fifth working day</u> of the month. Failure to comply with requirement will result in the agency not receiving reimbursement until the following month.

You are aware that Portland Public Schools will be closed on May 12, 1972, twenty days short of a normal school year length. This closure is necessitated by the defeat of the District's proposed special operating levy for the fiscal year 1971-72 at elections in May, June, and September, 1971.

One hundred one (101) children who are residents of the Model Neighborhood are enrolled in Beaverton, David Douglas, Lake Oswego, and Parkrose schools. These schools will be operating during their normal sessions, ending about June 9. Transportation costs for these children to their schools have been borne by Portland Public Schools. Due to failure of the elections, there are no funds available to provide transportation for 101 children during the period May 15 through June 9.

This letter requests funding to provide transportation for these children during this period in the amount of \$4,886, distributed as follows:

SUBJECT: Reallocation of Preschool Expansion Funds

The CPB recently voted to provide funds for the transportation of children who are currently being bussed to school districts outside the City of Portland. The amount of this allocation is \$4,888 and is to come from a contract currently being administered by School District #1 (Preschool Expansion).

An amendment to the Preschool Expansion Contract will be necessary. Transportation of school children outside the School District is not a part of the original project description.

The Doard also voted to decrease the Preschool Expansion contract by \$4,500. This decision is a result of additional funds needed by the 4-C Council in order to provide care for those children who are being displaced as a result of the early closing of the school system.

On the latter issue, concurrence is required from the School District before this deduction may be made.

Could you see to it that the necessary ordinances are prepared? New budgets and project descriptions to follow.
