

SUBJECT: Project Information Inputs

To facilitate the evaluation of the Union Avenue Redevelopment Project (U.A.R.P.), I request that you or your staff provide the following information on an on-going basis:

1. Prior notification of all meetings of the Union Avenue Redevelopment Project Steering Committee and the meeting agendas.
2. Prior notification of all meetings of U.A.R.P. staff with agencies, working committees, neighborhood associations, and CPB concerning substantive policy and planning process matters.
3. Copies of minutes of the Union Avenue Redevelopment Project Steering Committee meetings.
4. Copies of major documents concerning problem formulation, data collection, data analysis, planning process, program policies, and plans developed.
5. Copies of proposals and contracts for studies and other work sub-contracted to other agencies or firms.

In addition, I request that we arrange a monthly meeting at a mutually convenient time between your staff and myself to discuss the activities and project outputs. May I suggest we meet sometime during the next week to discuss the above information inputs to the evaluation and the progress of U.A.R.P. to date. Let me know what time is most convenient.
