Summary of Budget Conditions

1. <u>Background Information</u>

New monies have been received by the Model Cities Agency in the following amounts:

HUD allocation from 1973/74 impounded funds	\$389,000
Little League turnback of 1974/75 approved budget	1,900
Bureau of Human Resources turnback of 1973/ 1974 budget	15,000
Total amount to be allocated	\$405,900

2. Policy Conditions

- A. In budget deliberations for Fiscal Year 1974/75 no new programs will be considered.
- B. Programs which received one-time grants in the Third-Action Year Extension were originally recommended not to be refunded. (Board action and new monies can alter this policy)
- C. No funds for Fiscal Year 1974/75 will be allocated to Relocation except as required by HUD.

Priorities

The Budget Review Committee prioritized programs based on the following criteria:

- A. Need
- B. Performance
- C. Future fundability

After considering the above criteria, the Citizens Planning Board categorized the programs into 4 areas:

Category I - Recommended for funding
Category II - Recommended for funding only after Category I
programs were funded
Category III - Recommended for no funding (See Policy Condition B)
Category IV - Other programs administered by Model Cities

4. Funding Recommendation

Taking into consideration the amount of funds available, the policy recommendations, the priority groupings, the Budget Review Committee recommends the following programs for funding at the levels indicated:
