

An Ordinance relating to the duties and Compensation of the Recorder.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

- Sectn. 1. The Recorder of the City of Portland, shall on the first day of each month, or within three days thereafter, make and file with the Auditor a full and complete report, setting forth in appropriate columns, the names of persons charged with violation of City Ordinances, the name of the officer making the arrest, the date thereof, the amount of fine the Recorder, Marshals, and witnesses, less, with the name of the person to whom the same may be due, the amount of fine or length of commitment, as the case may be, and the amount of all fines, fees or other monies collected.
- Sectn. 2. All fines, fees or other monies received by the Recorder or paid into his Court, when not acting as a Justice of the Peace, shall be paid into the City Treasury, at the time of making the monthly reports specified in Section One of this ordinance, and duplicate receipts taken therefor one of which shall be filed with said report.
- Sectn. 3. Accompanying such report the Recorder shall file a statement in detail of the amount of fees earned or claimed by him for services rendered as such Recorder, other than while acting as a Justice of the Peace which said fees shall be the same as are allowed to Justices of the Peace for similar services.

Services, and the Auditor <sup>shall</sup> then audit the same  
and if found correct, report the same to the  
Common Council at their thereafter as practi-  
cable, and upon the order of the Common Coun-  
cil a warrant shall be drawn upon the Treas-  
ury for two thirds of the amount thereof.

hereby repealed.
