

An Ordinance relating to the duties and Compensation of the Recorder.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Recorder of the City of Portland, shall on the first day of each month, or within three days thereafter, make and file with the Auditor a full and complete report, setting forth in appropriate Columns, the names of persons charged with violations of City Ordinances, the name of the officer making the arrest, the date thereof, the amount of ~~fine~~ the Recorder's Marshals, and ~~other~~ fees, with the name of the person to whom the same may be due, the amount of fine or ~~length~~ ^{term} of commitment, as the case may be, and the amount of all fees, fees or other moneys collected.

Section 2. All fees, fees or other moneys received by the Recorder or paid into his Court, when not acting as a Justice of the Peace, shall be paid into the City Treasury, at the time of making the monthly reports specified in Section One of this ordinance, and duplicate receipts taken therefor one of which shall be filed with said reports.

Section 3. Accompanying such report the Recorder shall file a statement in detail of the amount of fees earned or claimed by him for services rendered as such Recorder, other than while acting as a Justice of the Peace where said fees shall be the same as are allowed to Justices of the Peace, or similar.

Services, and the Auditor shall audit the same
and if found correct, report the same to the
Common Council as soon thereafter as practicable,
and upon the order of the Common Council
a warrant shall be drawn upon the Treasury
for two thirds of the amount thereof.

Section 4. An Ordinance entitled "an Ordinance regulating
the disposition of moneys arising from fines and
costs in the Recorder Court," passed Sept 16, 1865, is
hereby repealed.
