

An Ordinance 35

To encourage and regulate the growing of Shade
and Ornamental trees within the City.

The People of the City of Portland do ordain
as follows;

Section 1 Shade and ornamental trees may
be planted at the distance of Eight feet within
the streets and they shall be trimmed as the
Street Commissioner shall from time to time direct;
and if omitted the Commissioner may trim
such trees, in the month of April, if he shall
deem it necessary to the beauty or convenient
use of the streets, and the expense shall be
paid by the owner of the property to which
said trees are adjacent.

Section 2 Shade and ornamental trees, planted or
growing within the streets as permitted
by this ordinance may be protected by
such temporary frames or structures as the
Street Commissioner shall approve, to be
removed under the direction of the Street-
Commissioner when so instructed by the
City Council.

Section 3 The provisions of this ordinance shall
not apply to the front Street of the City.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force from
the time of its approval by the Mayor.
