Yours Com. to whom was referred the communication of Mr. C. Barrell in ref to selling his cemetery to this city— Respectfully submit— that while there has not been found on the west side of the river. A suitable location for a Burial ground, and while there is great inconvenience and expence in going to and from the ground heretofore used by the people, and now offered for sale by Mr. Barrell, we can not recommend the purchase of cemetery grounds on either side the river—but we would rather suggest, that this question be left to be developed by the enterprise of private parties, and that the city be no longer regarded as in the market to purchase grounds for the above purposes
