West Portland Town Center (WPTC) Plan	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Consultant team is collecting data for a market analysis, health equity indicators, and a list of best practices. Power Points for each will be shared at August CAG. 2. Prosper and BPS staff did a windshield survey of businesses. The results will be circulated once summarized. 3. BPS has collected existing conditions maps. Map package will be posted on project website – documents and resources – in next week. 4. Town Center plan kickoff occurred on April 27th at Markham School. Themes and notes are posted online. 5. Community walking tour set for June 15th. Focus is on public realm, infrastructure, and Barbur Transit Center

UniteOregon and CAT are conducting outreach for the community walking tour. 2. <i>"Our Common Values, Our Shared History, and Our Way Forward Together"</i> Community Conversation - Fair Housing Council of Oregon has developed an equity and fair housing curriculum for the CAGs and community at large, to be presented 2 to 4 times in coming months. First session tentatively scheduled for July 25, additional dates likely to be in September. 3. WPTC community charette workshops are planned for the fall of 2019
Barbur Transit Center planning	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Development Roadmap Memo complete, provides an overview of development code requirements 2. Work group met on May 28th to go over TOD examples, existing conditions, and questions to be answered by this project. ODOT is following up with research on parcel history and purchase conditions.
TriMet Affordable Housing MOU implementation	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. TriMet MOU workgroup convened for second time, meets monthly. They are sharing real estate market data with Portland. 2. TriMet's Transit Oriented Design (TOD) team and urban design team are coordinating with BPS and Barbur Transit Center development concept planning effort.

Corridor design work will result in a draft Community Design Report in the fall of 2019
