

I am writing about a trafffic hazard on 12th & West Burnside. The short block from Stark St. to Burnside should be re-routed in the opposite direction so that cars waiting for Burnside traffic to clear wouldn't dash out in front of rush hour traffic and cause much interference with free-flow movement on Burnside.

The Northbound traffic on 12th from Washington could turn at Stark.

RE: Tichner/West Burnside Intersection Improvements

Dear Sir:

Thank you for your letter of December 18. The Washington' Park Master Plan Study will probably go to Council in mid-February. In the meantime, we can say that we support the improvements to this intersection recommended in the Arlington Heights/Washington Park Traffic Plan. Improvement of this intersection would improve public access to Washington Park from downtown and from Northwest Portland and could result in a slight reduction of congestion along the present Vista Drive/Park Avenue access route. It might also result in a slight increase in park traffic along Tichner Avenue and Kingston Avenue, entering the park on Kingston. In addition, the improvements would allow residents of the Arlington Heights/Fairview area improved access and egress without driving through the park.

One of the problems we've identified with general park access is the lack of directional signing to Washington Park. We therefore recommend placement of appropriate signs on Burnside indicating the Tichner intersection as an access point to Washington Park (primarily) and the International Rose Test Gardens and Japanese Gardens (secondarily).

The Master Plan will recommend that in promotional activities and directional signing, Washington Park itself should be presented as the principal attraction, with the many excellent facilities such as OMSI, the zoo, BUREAU AND THE Western Forestry Center, Japanese Gardens, Rose Garden, etcetera being listed as supplemental attractions within the park.

The vehicular accident situation at W. Burnside St. and 9th Ave. now demands special attention.

Aside of signalization, which would work adversely with the existing Burnside signal system and entail great expense, there are several possible alternatives:

- 1. Reverse one-way operation from southbound to northbound between West Burnside St. and N.W. Couch St. and include a raised median in Burnside across 9th to prevent both eastbound and westbound left turns, which latter are now an accident cause.
- 2. Require southbound 9th to right turn at Burnside. Optional median would physically prevent straight and left turn movements, in addition to above.
- 3. Block 9th at the north side of Burnside, making 9th dead end and two way south of Couch.
- 4. Vacate 9th from Burnside to Couch. This would require unanimous consent of abutting property owners.

Your preferences and comments on these alternatives would be appreciated as soon as convenient by return of enclosed postal card. If a decisive preference is shown by all affected property owners for any one alternative, we plan to put it to temporary trial use for 60 days. We would notify you of the decision and the trial period.




