DESCRIPTION: Single bubbler black vitreous china drinking fountain mounted on a 36" square concrete base. Mounted at the base of the fountain imbedded in the concrete is a small bronze plaque (3 11/16" by 5 11/16") which reads as follows: "Roseway Lions Club 1959"

HISTORICAL DATA

An ordinance (#110143) was passed June 5, 1959 allowing the Roseway Lions Club to install a drinking fountain at N.E. 72nd Ave. and Sandy Blvd. The location and fountain were approved by the Bureau of Parks and the Commissioner in charge recommended the fountain be accepted as a gift. The Roseway Lions Club dedicated the fountain to the City of Portland as an act of civic interest. According to a telephone conversation (March 6, 1968) with Mr. D. D. Palmer, who was Chairman of the group at the time, the cost of the fountain was approximately \$200 and its placement as a public service was discussed in the club for several years prior to its installation. Mr. Palmer further stated that "due to the location being a bus stop, the fountain is enjoyed by many of the area residents". The dedication took place in April 1959 with Mr. Palmer and a few of the Roseway Lions Club Members present.

ORDINANCE NO. 110143

An Ordinance authorizing the acceptance, as a gift, of a drinking fountain, to be installed in street area at N. E. 72nd Avenue and Sandy Boulevard by the Roseway Lions Club, by D. D. Palmer, 7215 N. E. Sandy Boulevard, Portland 13, Oregon, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council finds that the Roseway Lions Club, by D. D. Palmer, 7215 N. E. Sandy Boulevard, Portland 13, Oregon, has offered to the City a drinking fountain to be installed at N. E. 72nd Avenue and Sandy Boulevard, and that the drinking fountain and location have both been inspected and recommended by A. W. Nussbaumer, Director of Operations and Maintenance, Bureau of Parks, and the Superintendent of the Bureau of Parks, and the Commissioner in charge thereof has recommended that the said fountain be accepted as a gift and the Lions Club be permitted to install the same with the cooperation of the Bureau of Parks, and that the said Lions Club be permitted to place an identification plaque on the base of the said fountain; now, therefore, the gift of one drinking fountain by the Roseway Lions Club, by D. D. Palmer, 7215 N. E. Sandy Boulevard, Portland, hereby is accepted, and its installation and maintenance by the Bureau of Parks in the parkway at N. E. 72nd Avenue and Sandy Boulevard hereby is authorized and directed.

Section 2. The Council of the city of Portland, in accepting this gift from the Roseway Lions Club, does hereby extend its thanks and appreciation to the Club's Community Betterment Committee and all members of the Club, for their civic interest, which has motivated this gift to the city of Portland, and authority is hereby granted for the said Club to place a small identification plaque at the base of the said fountain.

Section 3. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the city of Portland in this: In order that the gift of the Roseway Lions Club may be put in service for the summer months; therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
