

**ORDINANCE NO. 160579**

- \* Authorize application for a grant from the American Water Works Association to conduct a study on the effectiveness of watershed management practices. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. That in August 1987, the American Water Works Association Research Foundation (AWWARF) requested that interested water utilities and other organizations submit proposals for conducting a study to evaluate the effectiveness of watershed management practices for protecting water quality.
2. That the AWWARF will, if a grant is approved, provide 75 percent of the total project cost up to a maximum of \$75,000; and 25 percent is required for the City's matching share if the total project cost does not exceed \$100,000.
3. That the City will fund the balance of the total costs in excess of \$100,000 and that the City's total contribution is estimated to be \$75,000.
4. That the project is critical to implementation of the Surface Water Treatment Rule because information obtained from the study will be used to evaluate the City of Portland's watershed program and expand the City's knowledge of watershed management practices.
5. That it is appropriate that the City make application for such a grant, and if approved, execute an agreement with the AWWARF.
6. That the Water Bureau has developed a proposal that would, if accepted, further the objectives of the City to maintain a leadership role among water utilities in guiding changes in the Safe Drinking Water Act, as amended in 1986 (Public Law 99-339), and in watershed management.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. That the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Portland, is hereby authorized to make application to the American Water Works Association Research Foundation for a grant to conduct a study on the effectiveness of watershed management practices.

- b. That the Mayor and his designees are hereby authorized to provide the American Water Works Research Foundation with such information and assurances as may be necessary for their consideration of said grant.
- c. That the grant contract will not require additional personnel and appropriation for FY 1987-88.
- d. That any additional personnel and appropriation required in FY 1988-89 as a result of the grant contract will be addressed through the quarterly budget process next fiscal year.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in the approval of this proposal will result in the loss of opportunity to receive a grant; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
