ORDINANCE NO.

An Ordinance authorizing the Purchasing Agent to sign a Purchase Order as a contract with Henshaw dba Amaricore, PO Box 16798, Portland, OR 97216 for providing bus shelters and a Contract Release Order (CRO) with the State of Oregon for Price Agreement No. 33-100-5465 as governed by the UMTA Provisions for Grant Funded Procurement, for the Bureau of Transportation Engineering at the estimated amount of \$46,200.00, authorizing the drawing and delivery of warrant(s), waiving performance bond requirements and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds

- 1. Tri-Met and the City have entered into an agreement to construct transit transfer sites at various locations city-wide.
- 2. The first contract for Transit Transfer Project Unit 1-A to improve transit transfer sites at the intersections of SE Powell Boulevard and SE Milwaukie Avenue, N Interstate Avenue and N Lombard Street, SE 11th Avenue and Madison Street, and SE 39th Avenue and Hawthorne Boulevard was authorized by Ordinance 158240.
- 3. The second contract package under this agreement which will improve a transit transfer site on NE Occident Street near NE Holladay Street and NE Hassalo Street, was bid as Transit Transfer Project Unit 1-B.
- 4. Direct purchase of bus shelters from Amaricore using the State of Oregon Price Agreement No. 33-100-5465 is the most cost effective method of providing shelters for these projects.
- 5. This method of purchase has been reviewed and approved by the City Purchasing Agent.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Purchasing Agent shall sign a Purchase Order to serve as a contract with Amaricore, PO Box 16798, Portland, OR 97216 and a State of Oregon CRO for providing bus shelters for Transit Transfer Projects Unit 1-A and 1-B for the total estimated amount of \$46,200 and waiving performance bond requirements. The Purchase Order shall be approved as to form by the City Attorney.

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- b. The Mayor and the Auditor are authorized to draw and deliver warrant(s) chargable to the Bureau of Transportation Engineering, when demand is presented and approved by the proper authorities.
- Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding with the purchase may result in additional expense, and will unnecessarily deprive the City of the benefits of completion of the project at an early date, therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
