

## **Project Vicinity**






### **Process Diagram**






### Enhance pedestrian safety and convenience.



Excess driveways conflict with pedestrian access.



Long distance between pedestrian crossings.





### Provide good connection between neighborhoods.



The street can be a barrier to neighborhood access for pedestrians and cyclists.



Left turns restrictions limit access for vehicles.



### Improve drivers' safety and convenience.



The unprotected left turn at 47th/Sandy Boulevard causes safety problems.



Circulation in Hollywood can be confusing.



Support access to businesses and residential neighborhoods.



Many businesses rely on freight truck access.



Proximity to I-84 on-ramps affects circulation in Hollywood.



On-street parking is critical for small businesses.



### Improve bicycle safety and convenience.



NE 37th/Sandy Boulevard/I-84 is a difficult intersection for cyclists.



More bicycle parking is needed throughout Sandy Boulevard.



Increase safety and convenience for transit users.




Transit stops are inconsistently spaced.



The poor pedestrian environment affects passengers waiting for the bus.








### **Recommended Improvements**

- Construct curb extensions
- Consolidate driveways






# Goal: Provide good connections between neighborhoods.



- Ornamental streetlights
- New left turns onto Sandy Boulevard
- New pedestrian crossings
- New traffic signal
- New protected left turns from Sandy Boulevard






Goal: Improve drivers safety and convenience.



- New signage to clarify wayfinding for vehicles on 39th
- Consolidate driveways
- New protected left turns
- Simplify the NE 20th Avenue intersection






#### Goal: Support access to business and residential neighborhoods.

#### **Recommended Improvements**

- Make NE Broadway Street into a two-way street east of NE 37th
- Maintain or increase on-street parking spaces
- Add new protected left turns to and from Sandy Boulevard






Goal: Improve bicycle safety and convenience.



- New north-south bicycle connection
- Add bicycle parking throughout the corridor
- Add a new westbound bike lane between NE 38th Avenue and I-84 to separate cyclists from vehicles accessing freeway






#### Goal: Increase safety and convenience for transit users.



- Add transit curb extensions to provide space for benches and shelters
- Adjust bus stop locations to improve service
- Coordinate bus stop locations with pedestrian improvements






## landscaping.

#### **Recommended Improvements**

- Add new street trees
- Replace damaged or unhealthy street trees
- Several landscaped water detention and water quality swales






Goal: Support the community identity.




- Add streetscape elements, such as decorative streetlights and new street trees
- Key improvements at neighborhood gateways
- Reclaim the excess asphalt areas along Sandy Boulevard
- Redesign the public spaces at NE 39th and 42nd Avenues
