Support the efforts of the Portland Oregon Sports Authority to secure the Women's World Cup in Portland, Oregon in 1999

WHEREAS, the City of Portland has within its jurisdiction facilities, access roads, thoroughfares and other area which may be used for the purposes of organizing, financing, promoting, accommodating, staging, and conducting the 1999 Women's World Cup and its related activities, and,

WHEREAS, hosting the 1999 Women's World Cup will generate international goodwill, enhance the worldwide renown and prestige of the City of Portland, produce new jobs and potentially create substantial beneficial economic activity, and,

WHEREAS, the Women's World Cup 1999 Organizing Committee, Inc., the entity authorized by the Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) and the U.S. Soccer Federation to organize and stage the 1999 Women's World Cup, has requested a declaration of support from the City of Portland and certain guarantees concerning the performance of reasonably necessary government services in connection with the event as part of the formal bid made by Portland, Oregon to be designated as a 1999 Women's World Cup venue,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Portland welcomes the 1999 Women's World Cup and to that end declares its full support of the efforts of the Portland Oregon Sports Authority to have Portland, Oregon selected as a 1999 Women's World Cup venue site, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon designation of Portland, Oregon as a 1999 Women's World Cup venue, and at all times thereafter, the local community partners will coordinate all federal efforts related to the hosting of the event with the Organizing Committee and will refrain from independent efforts to secure federal support associated the 1999 Women's World Cup without the authorization of the Organizing Committee, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon designation of Portland, Oregon as a 1999 Women's World Cup venue, and at all times thereafter, the City of Portland and its agencies, departments and personnel, agree to work in partnership with the Organizing Committee to provide governmental services reasonably necessary, (including, but not limited to, public safety, security, fire and medical emergency, and traffic control) to assure the success of the 1999 Women's World Cup within its jurisdiction
