1196 Confirm appointment of John Eskildsen to the Portland Development Commission (Report)

Discussion: Ken Ouderkirk, Portland Oregon Sports Authority, described efforts of his organization to hold the World Cup here in 1999.

> **Discussion:** Dennis Nelson, Manager, License Bureau, said this resolution does three things: 1) recognizes the planning efforts underway already; 2) appoints the License Bureau to take the lead role in coordinating the City's efforts; and 3) directs the Bureau to report back within 120 days with a work plan and fiscal impact statement. This is about getting the infrastructure in place to handle events of this magnitude.

David Knowles, Planning Bureau Director and a member of the Sports

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Authority board, said this is a great opportunity to showcase the City and link the games with other events in town, such as the arts.

1205 Assess benefitted property for the cost of improving streets within the Harney Park HCD Local Improvement District (Second Reading Agenda 1192; C-9878) **Discussion:** Lola Gailey, Office of Transportation, reviewed the testimony heard by Council last week from three property owners who were unhappy about portions the project. She noted that this was a two-year construction project, 80 percent subsidized by a Housing and Community Development Commission block grant. Regarding the complaint by Katherine Hale, 7103 SE Sherrett, about grading and seeding, the Parks Bureau has agreed to smooth the grade, remove excess gravel and reseed as necessary. Staff also looked into a complaint from Linda Singer, 7101 SE Sherrett, that her driveway was put in the wrong place. Staff found it was done according to the plan and that she was given the option, as were other property owners, of adding additional paving but chose not to do so because of the extra cost. In response to safety concerns voiced by Jerry Watzlawick, 7110 SE Sherrett, about the turn at 72nd onto Sherrett, Transportation has agreed to remove parking on one side of the street for the first 50 feet and will monitor the results. Ms. Gailey noted that of 180 property owners, five remonstrances were received and the project has resulted in a lot of upgrading by many property owners.

Commissioner Kafoury said this project has made a big difference in the neighborhood.

1206 Tentatively grant appeals of Metro Washington Park Zoo and Portland Parks and Recreation, applicants, of Hearings Officer's decision and approve, with added conditions for pedestrian pathway, the Master Plan for the Washington Park Zoo at 4001 SW Canyon Road (Findings; Previous Agenda 1099; 97-00127 CU MS)

> **Discussion:** Sue Donaldson, Planning Bureau, noted that several minor revisions had been made in the final set of supplemental findings to clarify the actual procedure to be used to modify the Master Plan. The understanding reached at the Council hearing was that there was a possibility that a safe accessible pedestrian connection could be made between the Hoyt Arboretum and the Light Rail station. That connection may or may not go through Zoo property. The purpose of this time out is to find a solution acceptable to both parties and both parties are prepared to do that. These supplemental findings set a time limit for coming up with a plan and then amending the Master Plan to reflect it. The procedure for doing that will be a Type II Master Plan amendment and the final decision will be an administrative one made by the Planning Bureau. Ms. Donaldson said she did not require the parties to return to Council because she assumed the Commissioners did not need to know unless there was a problem.

Commissioner Kafoury said if there is a problem there is always the option of bringing it to Council for advice or a decision.

Ms. Donaldson said there are also modifications to the findings dealing with the parking lot landscaping, which was not an issue but the modified findings do try to identify what "safe and accessible" means and set up a procedure for making sure that happens.

Kathryn Beaumont, Senior Deputy City Attorney said Council should adopt the Hearings Officer's decision except as superseded and amended by the Supplemental Findings submitted by the Planning Bureau and also adopted by Council.

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Commissioner Kafoury so moved and Commissioner Sten seconded.

Disposition: Findings Adopted. (Y-3)
