ORDINANCE No. 183561

*Authorize Intergovernmental Agreement with the Portland Development Commission to provide Urban Renewal Funds for the construction of the N Rosa Parks Way Improvements within the Interstate Corridor Urban Renewal Area (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Interstate Corridor URA Transportation Strategy (2001) has recently been updated through a collaborative and detailed process undertaken by Portland Development Commission (PDC), Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT), the Interstate Corridor Urban Renewal Advisory Committee (ICURAC) and the ICURAC Transportation Subcommittee and with input from the Interstate Corridor Urban Renewal Area (ICURA) community. The purpose of updating the strategy was to provide a framework for selecting and implementing transportation projects in the ICURA over the remaining life of the URA.
- 2. The goals of the selected projects are to support redevelopment from smaller-scale projects and to focus on community and safety enhancements. The smaller-scale projects prioritize safer routes to school and projects that increase safety along popular pedestrian and bicycle routes.
- 3. N. Rosa Parks Way Improvements is one of the projects identified in an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with PDC within the Interstate Urban Renewal Area (ICURA). This project will include bicycle lanes between N. Vancouver Avenue and N. Montana Avenue on N. Rosa Parks Way. The project will also include traffic signal modifications at the intersection of I-5 and Rosa Parks Way including a bike signal. This IGA covers the construction phase of the traffic signal modifications. The project may be bid under the Shelter Market Program. The estimate for this project is \$115,000.00.
- 4. The Bureau's level of confidence in the cost estimates for these projects are moderate. The projects are either in the design phase or ready for construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. That the Mayor and the Auditor are authorized to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland Development Commission to provide Urban Renewal Funds for completion of the construction of the N. Rosa Parks Way Improvements, substantially in accordance with the Agreement attached to the original of this Ordinance, and by reference made a part hereof.
- b. The Mayor and the Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Transportation Fund, when demand is presented and approved by the proper authorities.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because some of the projects have to start construction as soon as the ordinance is passed. Other projects need to start design now to be able to bid during the next construction season; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
