In FY 2009-2010, the City accepted a grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in the amount of \$4,172,282 for the Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The City of Portland obligated \$2,000,554 of accepted HPRP funds to HAP through Subrecipient Contract No. 32000138, with intent to obligate an additional \$1,973,114 in HPRP funds to HAP through a separate subrecipient contract in 2010-2011, but recently communicated HUD regulations require immediate obligation of all HPRP subrecipient funds. The additional HPRP funds were appropriated to the FY 2009-2010 budget through the Winter BuMP.

The proposed amendment to this contract will also extend the effective date and duration of the contract to June 30, 2011, to fund continued homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing activities through the full amended contract period.



6. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

In FY 2009-2010, the City accepted a grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in the amount of \$4,172,282 for the Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The City of Portland obligated \$2,000,554 of accepted HPRP funds to the Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) through Subrecipient Contract No. 32000138, with intent to obligate an additional \$1,973,114 in HPRP funds to HAP through a separate subrecipient contract in 2010-2011, but recently communicated HUD regulations require immediate obligation of all HPRP subrecipient funds. The proposed amendment will also extend the effective date and duration of the contract to June 30, 2011.

In total, this contract and proposed amendment will allow HAP's Short-Term Rent Assistance (STRA) program to provide homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing activities, primarily rent and housing placement assistance, to more than 1,500 eligible households through 18 community based agencies throughout Multnomah County. Especially in the current economic climate, these are cost-effective and essential safety net services.
