ORDINANCE NO. 183670

Authorize application to the Department of Homeland Security for a grant in the amount of \$317,419 for the Metropolitan Medical Response System (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In 1999, the U.S. Public Health Service, Dept. of Health and Human Services (USPHS) expanded the Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS) to assist large metropolitan areas in planning and developing response capabilities for emergency response, triage and treatment to a Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) event.
- 2. In 2001, the City of Portland received a federal award of \$600,000 for work completed on the 1999 contract. In addition to developing the plan, training was required as well as the purchase of equipment and pharmaceuticals for responding to the health and medical consequences of a nuclear, biological or chemical terrorist incident.
- 3. Since 2004, the City has been awarded \$2,040,509 in supplemental grant funds from the Metropolitan Medical Response System to continue to build on the Regional Concept of Operations.
- 4. Currently, additional federal funds are available to purchase additional medical supplies and pay for planning travel.
- 5. No match is required by this grant

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the Department of Homeland Security for a grant in the amount of \$ 317,419.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because failure to apply for the grant in a timely fashion will delay the community benefit of this program. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
