

ORDINANCE No. 183740

*Authorize Intergovernmental Agreement with Clackamas County for construction and management of that portion of the Springwater Corridor in Clackamas County (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:


1. The Springwater Corridor, managed by Portland Parks & Recreation (Parks), extends from the Willamette River in Portland to milepost 21.573 in Boring, Oregon.
2. The portion of the trail in Clackamas County, between Dee St. and Rugg Rd. in Boring, is currently an unimproved, gravel trail.
3. Clackamas County Parks has been awarded \$1.2 million in Oregon Department of Transportation Enhancement funding to build the 2.2 mile Clackamas County portion of the Springwater Corridor.
4. Paving the trail will allow this portion of the trail to be used more effectively as a recreational and transportation corridor.
5. Clackamas County is willing to construct, maintain and manage the trail once construction is complete.
6. Clackamas County and Portland Parks & Recreation have negotiated an Intergovernmental Agreement giving Clackamas County the right to build, operate, maintain and repair the Springwater Trail in Clackamas County.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council Directs:

- a. The Commissioner in Charge of Parks is authorized to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with Clackamas County for construction and management of a portion of the Springwater Corridor. Such agreement shall be in a form substantially similar to the form of agreement attached hereto, as approved as to form by the City Attorney.
- b. The Director of Parks is authorized to sign any documents or agreements requested by Clackamas County that are necessary to obtain grant funds for the construction, management or repair, both now and in the future, of the Springwater Corridor.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in order to avoid further delay in securing funding and building the Springwater Trail in Clackamas County; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
