An Ordinance adopting the report of the Surveyor in the matter of the proposed extension of Madison street from the west side line of Eighth street to the west side line of Twelfth street, and directing an entry of the assessment hereby made at the docket of City Dues.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Sec 1 The Common Council of the City of Portland, deeming it expedient to extend the lines of Madison street from the west side line of Eighth street to the west side line of Twelfth street, did on the 4th day of December 1878, direct the City Surveyor to survey the same and make his report with plat, which said report and plat was adopted by Ordinance No 3367 entitled "An Ordinance adopting the report of the City Surveyor in the matter of the extension of Madison street from the west line of Eighth street to the west side line of Twelfth street" and afterwards to wit: on the fifth day of March 1879, the Common Council of the City of Portland, resolved C. M. Burroughs, S. Morris and P. M. Giddings minors of the proposed extension, to meet at the office of the Auditor & Clerk of the City of Portland, on Saturday the 13th day of March 1879, at 10 o'clock A.M. of which due notice was given by publication in the "Daily Bee" a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Portland, in the manner provided by law, and said minors having met at the time and place appointed, and being duly sworn, have made said report, and their report shown, including all assessments of benefits and damages to certain property shown specified, which said report and assessment being satisfactory to the Common Council, is hereby adopted, of which said report and assessment, the following is a copy:

To the Hon. Common Council of
the City of Portland.
Gentlemen;

The undersigned aforesaid minors, of the proposed extension of Madison Street, from the west line of Eighth street to the east side line of Twelfth street in the City of Portland by a resolution adopted by your Honorable body on the 5th day of March 1879, respectfully report. That pursuant to said resolution and notice published in the "Daily Bee", we met at the time and place appointed to wit, at the office of the Auditor & Clerk of the City of Portland, on Saturday, March 13th, 1879, at 10 o'clock A.M. of each day and being first duly sworn and furnished with a copy

of the Surveyor report, and that of said extension adopted by Ordinance No 23617, entitled "An Ordinance adopting the report of the City Surveyor in the matter of the proposed extension of Madison Street from the west line of Eighth Street to Gulf Street, providing to view the proposed extension of said Madison Street to the owners of the several pieces, parcels, or lots of land, hereinafter set forth and described, (in United States Gold Coin) as follows:
