

Ordinance No. 23067.

An Ordinance prohibiting the use of roller skates for the purpose of skating upon any of the streets or sidewalks within the fire limits of the City of Portland, providing a penalty for violation thereof and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to use roller skates for the purpose of skating upon any of the streets or sidewalks within the inner fire limits of the City of Portland as defined by Ordinance No. 18277 and amendatory ordinances thereof.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof in the Municipal Court be punished by a fine of not more than \$25.00.

Section 3. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, peace and safety of the City of Portland and the inhabitants thereof in this. That many persons, particularly boys and girls, are now using the streets and sidewalks within the inner fire limits of the City of Portland for the purpose of skating and such practice is not only dangerous to said children but to other persons, therefore an emergency is hereby declared and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor.
