ORDINANCE No. 105998

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to Portland General Electric Company, its successors and assigns, 621 S.W. Alder Street, Portland 5, Oregon, to construct, operate and maintain a 115,000 volt power line from Sellwood Substation to S.E. Nehalem Street and S.E. Grand Avenue, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It appearing to the Council that Portland General Electric Company has applied through C.E. Robertson. Right-of-Way Engineer, for permission to construct, operate and maintain a 115,000 volt power line beginning at the Sellwood Substation at S.E. 13th Avenue and S.E. Ochoco Street, northerly along the east side of S.E. 13th Avenue to the north side of S.E. Linn Street, thence westerly to the westerly side of S.E. 11th Avenue, thence northerly to the south side of S.E. Nehalem Street, thence westerly to private property at S.E. Nehalem Street and S.E. Grand Avenue, and that such installations are needed in order to increase the capacity and efficiency of the Sellwood Substation, and that a permit shall be granted subject to terms and conditions herein stated; now, therefore, a revocable permit is hereby granted to Portland General Electric Company, its successors and assigna (hereinafter referred to as the grantee) to construct, operate and maintain a 115,000 volt power line over and along the above mentioned streets, this permit being effective only as far as the street area is concerned, the power lines to be located as shown on the attached plan marked "Exhibit A" and hereby made a part of this ordinance; provided that all pcle structures, lines, equipment and appurtenances installed pursuant to this permit shall be constructed, installed, maintained and operated in accordance with specifications, rules and regulations set forth in the National Safety Code of the United States Bureau of Standards as said specifications, rules and regulations presently appear and as the same may be changed, altered or amended in the life of the permit hereby granted.

Section 2. The permit hereby granted is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Council, and no expenditure of money hereunder, or lapse of time, or other act or thing shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland, or be held to give the grantee, its successors and assigns, any vested or other right. Upon revocation, the grantee, its successors or assigns, shall within ninety (90) days, unless the Council further extends the time, remove all poles, wires and/or other structures or things of whatever nature appurtenant thereto

installed under this permit, and shall leave the said street area in a safe and orderly condition, all to be done as directed by and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.

Section 3. The permit hereby granted is for the use of the street area only, and shall not exempt the grantee from taking out any licenses or permits required by any existing ordinances for any operation, construction and/or maintenance carried on under the permit hereby granted, and this permit shall be authorization for the City Engineer to issue permits for the erection of poles or other installations in the street area, upon application by the grantee, accompanied by detailed plans for such construction.

Section 4. The grantee shall hold the City of Portland, the City Engineer, and each and all of the officers and employes of said City free and harmless from any claims for damages to persons or property which may be occasioned by any construction, operation or maintenance carried on under the permit hereby granted.

Section 5. Within thirty (30) days after the passage of this ordinance, said grantee shall file with the City Auditor its written acceptance of this ordinance and of the terms and conditions herein expressed, in form to be approved by the City Attorney.

Section 6. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that the privileges granted by this ordinance may be available to the grantee without undue delay; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
