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ORDINANCE NO. 125936

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to Union Oil Company of California to construct a flammable liquids storage tank at their property at 5528 N.W. Doane Avenue, subject to certain conditions, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that on or about November 27. 1967, Union Oil Company of California, by J.R. Hannaman, Project Manager, C/o 5528 N.W. Doane Avenue, Portland, Oregon 97208, has requested permission to construct an additional flammable liquids storage tank at its Terminal at 5528 N.W. Doane Avenue and to change the location of tank No. 4258 and to increase its capacity from 325 to 480 barrels; that inspection has been made of the premises by the Bureau of Buildings and the Building Inspections Director has recommended that the permit be granted subject to the conditions recommended by the Fire Marshal, as contained in said Fire Marshal's report dated December 5, 1967; that said report shows that the proposed construction conforms gener-ally to requirements of Article 14 of the Fire Code and Volume 1 of the National Fire Codes, with the exception of Section 14-1410 (b) of the Fire Code with reference to distances between tanks of two separate companies, which exception may be approved upon waiver of consent, hereinafter made a condition of this permit, and the Council finds that said revocable permit should be granted under certain conditions; now, therefore, a revocable permit hereby is granted to Union Oil Company of California by J.R. Hannaman, Project Manager, to construct an additional flammable liquids storage tank on their property at 5528 N.W. Doane Avenue and to enlarge the capacity of one and change its location, at its tank yard 5528 N.W. Doane Avenue, in the City of Portland, all in accordance with the following terms and conditions:

a. That the Company's drawing No. 6701-Y-5-2, dated June 22, 1967, revised November 21, 1967, and the Company's permit application letter dated November 27, 1967, shall become part of this ordinance permit.

b. That no flammable liquid with boil-over characteristics shall be stored in any tank authorized in this ordinance.

c. That no flammable liquid having a flash point below 73°F. and having a boiling point below 100°F. shall be stored in any tank built to API Standard No. 650 specifications.

d.That the tanks shall be built in accordance with the American Petroleum Institute Standard No. 650, entitled "Welded Steel Tanks for Oil Storage, Second Ed. April 1964", and shall bear the API Monogram.

e. That all pipes, values and fittings shall be equal to the requirements of Chapter III of the Flammable and Combustible Liquids Code, of Volume 1 of the National Fire Codes, "Flammable Liquids," 1966-67 Ed (NFPA Pamphlet No. 30).

f. That all construction, including tanks, tank pads, pipe supports, pumps and walkways shall be accomplished under permit from the Bureau of Buildings of the City and be in accordance with detailed drawings submitted to and approved by said Bureau.

g. That Union Oil Company of California obtain a letter of authorization from the Standard Oil Company of California in which the Standard Oil Company shall waive the requirement that Union Oil tanks No. 4258 and No. 4266 shall be not less than 15 feet from the Standard Oil Company's tank farm boundary line, and that in lieu of this spacing requirement the Fire Marshal may substitute the distance requirements provided in Section 14-1411 for the minimum distances between aboveground flammable liquids tanks.

Section 2. Nothing contained herein shall be taken or deemed to exempt the Union Oil Company of California from compliance with any other applicable provisions of the Fire Code or other ordinances of the City of Portland, and no expenditure of money, lapse of time, or any act or thing shall prevent the Council from at any time revoking this permit and requiring full compliance with the applicable provisions of laws, codes and ordinances of the City of Portland. No action shall be taken hereunder until a suitable document, approved as to form by the City Attorney, shall have been signed and filed with the City Auditor by said company, accepting and agreeing to the terms, provisions and conditions hereof.

Section 3. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that there may be no unnecessary delay in construction as set forth in Section 1 hereof, which construction is urgently needed; therefore an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
