



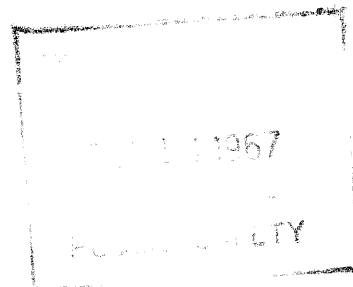

Dear Commissioner Earl:

We respectfully request an ordinance amending Section 3-1609 of the Administration Code to read as follows:

SALARY RATES FOR CALL SHIFTS IN BUREAU OF FIRE

A call shift in the Bureau of Fire is defined as a work shift filled by an off-duty employee during the absence of the regularly assigned employee.

Such a call shift shall normally be filled by Bureau of Fire members of the same rank as the regularly assigned employee. However, any member of the Bureau of Fire accepting a call shift in either a higher or lower classification shall work at his own regular rate of pay, except that members who are in Premium rate classes, or members assigned to the Fire Prevention Division shall be assigned call shifts in the Fire Fighting Division at the maximum rate of pay of the classification in which they have line status.

* * * * *

We believe that this proposed amendment is exactly in line with established procedures for assigning and paying for call shifts in the Bureau of Fire. It has been discussed with Mr. Robert E. Johnson and I am sure that he agrees.

ORDINANCE NO. 125965

An Ordinance amending Section 3-1609 of Ordinance No. 77780, Administration Code, relating to salary rates for call shifts in Bureau of Fire, to bring the provisions in line with practice, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that there is a discrepancy between the provisions of Section 3-1609 of Ordinance No. 77780, Administration Code, and the practice relating to salary rates for call shifts in the Bureau of Fire; that it has been recommended by the Chief, Bureau of Fire, and approved by the Commissioner in charge of the Bureau of Fire, that said section be amended to bring it in line with practice; now, therefore, Section 3-1609 of Ordinance No. 77780, Administration Code, passed by the Council September 3, 1942, as amended, hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 3-1609. SALARY RATES FOR CALL SHIFTS IN BUREAU OF FIRE.


A call shift in the Bureau of Fire is defined as a work shift filled by an off-duty employe during the absence of the regularly assigned employe.

Such a call shift shall normally be filled by Bureau of Fire members of the same rank as the regularly assigned employe. 

Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that there may be no delay in correlating code provisions with practice; therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
