ORDINANCE No. 130673

An Ordinance granting a leave of absence without pay to Charles C Hester, because of illness, for a period of six months, retroactive to March 11, 1970, and declaring an emergency.


The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that Charles C. Hester, Utility Worker, Bureau of Shops, Department of Public Affairs, has filed a request for leave of absence without pay because of illness for a period of six months, commencing March 11, 1970; that said request is accompanied by a statement from his physician, William B Evans, M.D., Medical Clinic, 4212 N E Broadway, Portland 97213, and the request has been approved by immediate supervisor and by the Commissioner in charge, and should be granted; Now, therefore, a leave of absence without pay hereby is granted to Charles C. Hester, Utility Worker, Bureau of Shops, because of illness for a period of six months, commencing retroactively from March 11, 1970.


Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that there may be no delay in granting the leave as set forth in Section 1 hereof, therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
