An Ordinance creating three positions of Video Production Assistant and abolishing one position of Fire Training Officer in the Bureau of Fire, Personnel Resources Division, amending the current Compensation Plan, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

- That the Video Production Studio within the Bureau of Fire's Personnel Resources Division is currently staffed with three part-time positions working 35 hours per week.
- 2. That Civil Service regulations restrict part-time personnel from exceeding a total of 860 hours per fiscal year. That in order to comply with this restriction, the Bureau of Fire Would need to hire additional part-time personnel, thereby necessitating greater amounts of training and orientation, and inevitably resulting in a decrease in studio performance.
- That the current and anticipated studio production workload requires a minimum of three full-time positions in addition to the Video Production Manager position.
- 4. That one position of Fire Training Officer can be abolished in order to offset the costs associated with this action. No additional appropriation will be required by the Bureau of Fire as a result of this action.
- 5. That the Chief of the Bureau of Fire has recommended and the Bureau of Personnel Services has approved this position change.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The following positions are created in the Bureau of Fire, Personnel Resources Division with salary rates as established in c. below:
