This is the second year that BPS will receive data from the State of Oregon to aid the marketing and communications with Portland businesses about recycling requirements.

1. 8. How Does This Relate to Current City Policies?

The State of Oregon has adopted aggressive waste reduction goals that rely on reducing garbage and increasing recycling for all sectors—residential, multifamily and commercial. ORS Chapter 459A.

On April 30, 2008, City Council adopted Resolution No. 36601 that established the following goals for the commercial solid waste and recycling system:

- promote sustainability of the solid waste and recycling system that includes maximum efficiency, equity and economic vitality, improved worker safety and reduced environmental and human health impacts over the entire life cycle of the materials; and
- minimize the impact of harmful wastes by targeting toxicity and reducing greenhouse gases emissions; and
- reduce per capita waste generation below 2005 levels by the year 2015; and

- maximize recovery of all waste with a target of 75% by the year 2015 and promote highest value use of the recovered materials.
